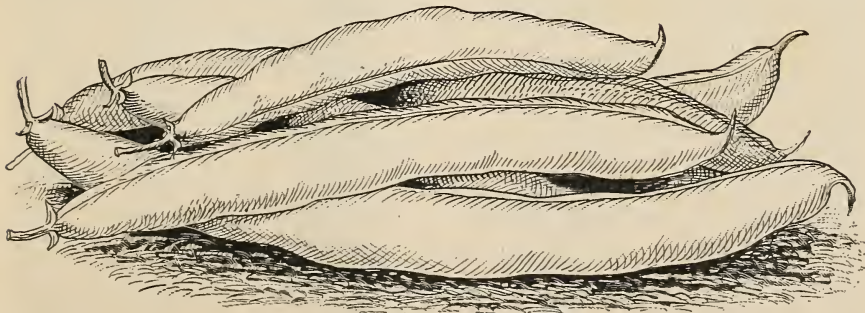

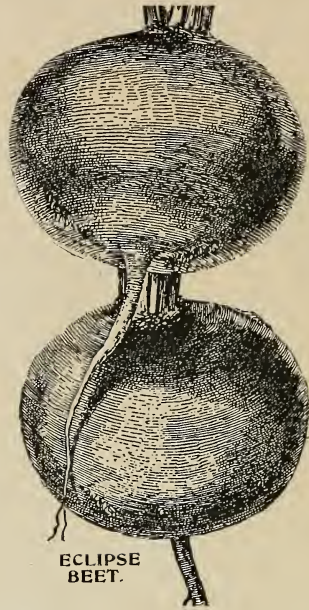

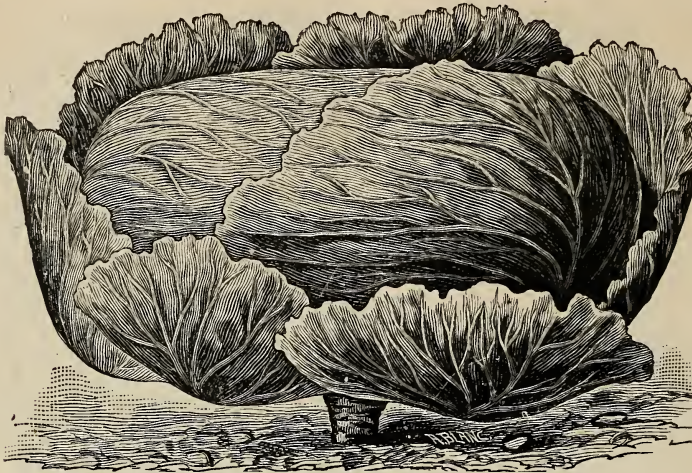
TRUE DANISH BALL HEAD CABBAGE.

Genuine Seed Grown in Denmark by a Prominent Danish Gardener.

THIS most beautiful Cabbage is rapidly growing in popularity in America on account of its remarkable solidity and keeping qualities. It is sold by vegetable dealers under the name of "Holland Seed Cabbage." For several years it has been so salable that it could be imported from Denmark at a profit. There is now a duty of 3 cents per head on it, and this will give American Growers control of the market. At first it was thought such solid heads could not be grown in this country. This has been found to be entirely untrue, if the genuine Danish Seed is used. The heads are not quite so large as Premium Flat Dutch, but on account of fine grain and solidity are much heavier. One-fourth more weight can be hauled in a car or wagon.
