It is not made of annual grasses for a quick show, or of the chaffy, light-weight seeds sold by some at cheap prices. Our Mixture weighs about 20 pounds to the measured bushel, and is not surpassed by any brand in this country.

REMEMBER that it is essential to dig the soil deep and prepare thoroughly, sow high grade seed liberally at the right time, and not less than four bushels (five

would be better) to the acre.

OLD LAWNS are greatly benefited if given a thorough raking as early in the spring as the weather will permit and then some fresh seed sprinkled on, which will renew the thin places and spots that have been killed out by weeds and other causes.

TIME TO SOW.—Lawn seed can be sown at almost any time from early spring

to late in the fall, but the best time is very early in the spring or about September 1st, depending somewhat on the condition of the season at the time of sowing.
