## POT <br> GROWN STRawberry Plants.

The Strawberre delights in good, rich, moist soil, but will grow on any soil which is capable of raising good general crops. Plants set in late summer or fall, under farorable circumstances, will produce fruit the following season. In hill culture plant 15 inches apart each way, in beds 4 feet wide, with alleys of 2 feet between them.
