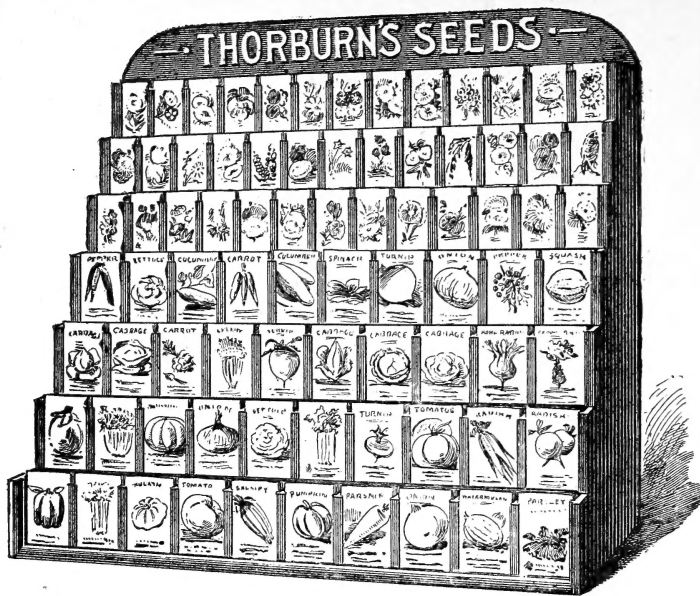

This novel cabinet is 30 inches high and only 15 inches wide—a convenient size for standing on a counter. It has 40 compartments for vegetable, and 39 for flower seeds. Each compartment holds 10 (or more) packets. The cabinet will thus hold 790 (or more) packets in 79 distinct sorts, the whole packet being visible. No matter how few packets are in the compartments, they can stand to the front, and the same uniform display is maintained as well when the cabinet is nearly empty as when it is full. 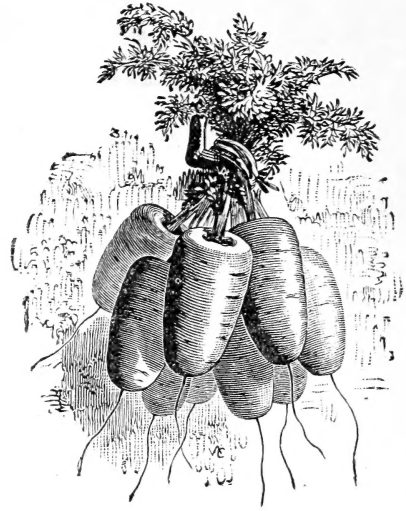

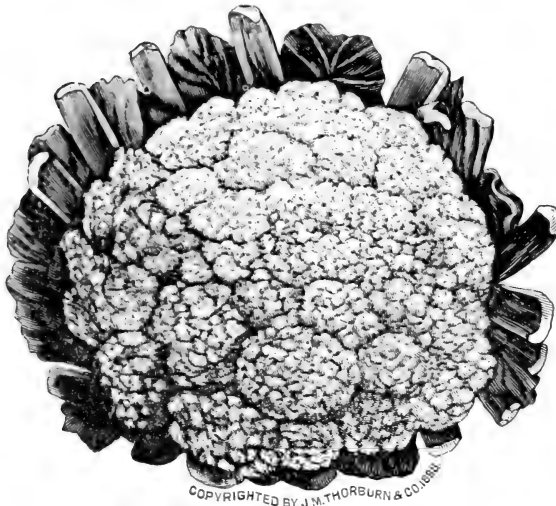
