## AUSTRALIAN STAR FLOWER

Cephalipterum drummondi.
A half hardy annual lately discovered in West Central Australia and never before offered. This surpassingly unique and bearitiful plant grows readily from seed in any ordinary garden soil, preferring a rather sandy one. Blooms early in the season
and continues in bloom for a long time. The fragrant flowers are of a peculiarly pleasing rosy crimson shade, sometimes approaching pure white, are produced in large graceful clusters which when cut will retain their form and color in perfection permanently, no other flower in any way equalling it in grace and keeping qualities. Full grown plants are about one foot high and the same across. Sow early in the open ground, or may be started early in the house and transplanted.. ## LACE FLOWER <br> Boykinia occidentalis var grandifora

A handsome tuberous perennial; leaves dark bronzy brown, round reniform, resembling some of the Begonias. Flowers purest white, with lace like petals borne on long loose panicles. Easily grown in any soil. The curious, small tubers keep well and can be planted at any season and are sure to bloom. (Photographs and cuts will be prepared)

## CREAM CUP <br> Platystemon Californicus

Delicate, poppy like plants which blonm early and abundantly; flowers vary from almost white through light cream to shades of yellow. Height, six to twelve inches. Treat same as other poppies. A specially fine strain.

## MIMULUS LUTEUS Gigantic Yellow

This new perennial Mimulus has the largest flowers, often one and a half to two inches across, pure lemon yeliow with a few crimsont dots. Height, one foot. Grows and blooms abundantly out of doors nearly all summer, even in bright sunshine. Has a hardy vigor, surpassing all other Mimulus. ## MIMULUS CARDINALIS

New Hybrids
A wonderful range of colors has been developed in these new cardinal flowers. Besides the usual red, this strain produces in profusion large flowers in various shades of yellow, orange, rose, pink, light crimson and white.

## ERYSIMUM GRANDIFLORUM

An early blooming Pacific Coast dwarf annual. Height, six to twelve inches. Flowers white, nearly half an inch across.

Handsome balf hardy or perhaps hardy low growing California perennial, especially fine for rock work. After the first season the plants produce flower stalks six inches high, bearing clusters of large, bright purple flowers. Rare.
