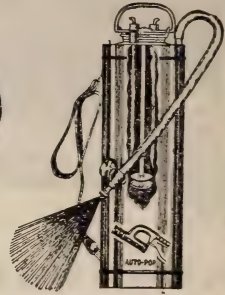

Bear in mind that your local dealer is obliged to pay the same rate of freight that you pay on your goods, and this cost of freight must be added to the cost of his goods when he figures his selling price.
