BURPEE'S SEEDS are grown either on our own farms or produced for us, of extra selected strains, in such sections of America and Europe as have proved best suited to the finest development of the various Vegetables, Flowers, and Grains.

At Wholesale—as well as at retail—we are "**A Mail-Order House**" *exclusively*. We never send out travelers to solicit orders. As a consequence, however, we are careful to attend promptly to inquiries by *mail* or *telegram*. In large lots on many varieties, this season, we are prepared to quote **special prices** upon request.

It pays to order early. Should any varieties be quoted lower in our general Trade List to be issued, as usual, January 1st, we shall give advantage of such reductions on all booked orders. Some prices are likely to advance,—thus you have everything to gain by placing your order early.

Terms of Credit.—To regular customers and well-known houses of established credit, all bills bought from this catalog are due June 1st, without regard to date of purchase, excepting Beans, Corn and Peas, on which terms are (except when included in a general order) sixty days net or subject to a discount of one and a half per cent. for cash within ten days of date of invoice.

Bills purchased **on special quotations**, made by letter or telegram, are *net* sixty days from date of invoice, or subject to a discount of one and a half per cent. for cash within ten days of date of invoice. Unknown correspondents desiring credit are requested to give satisfactory reference in Philadelphia or New York.

Cash Discount.—We allow a discount of **Five Per Cent.** on orders (at printed prices) accompanied by a cash remittance, and also on all bills, except where Beans, Corn and Peas only are ordered (at catalog prices) paid within ten days from date of invoice.

The Prices Quoted are those ruling at this date. We expect to adhere to these prices until the issue of our January catalog, except where important changes compel us to make advances or reductions, when we shall be governed by the market. **10 lbs. and more are supplied at the rates per 100 lbs.;** $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. and $\frac{1}{2}$ bushel at pound and bushel rates; but *smaller quantities will be charged at a slightly higher rate.*

NO CHARGE for Packing or Cartage.—Bags and boxes are charged *at Cost*. After delivering to forwarders in **good order** (as shown by Bill of Lading) our responsibility ceases.

Insurance will be effected only when so directed.

SEALED PACKAGES.—We make no charge for sealing **pounds, pecks, or bushels**, but at the low bulk prices quoted we shall charge for putting up in smaller sealed packages, when so ordered, as follows:

In Ounces.—One cent per ounce, 50 cts. per 100 ounces.

In Quarter-Pounds, Pints, and Quarts.—Two cents for each package.

In Two-Quarts and Four-Quarts.—A charge of three cents per package.

Telegraphic Cipher (or Cable Code)

FOR WEIGHTS AND MEASURES.

The telegraphic cipher word for quantities must always precede the cipher words for seed, but if the same quantity of several varieties is ordered, the cipher word meaning that quantity need be placed only before the first. For example:

Arad Jaundice, Jean, Benares, Calliope, Lamprey, Malmo Balcony, would mean, ship at once, cheapest route, ten pounds each **HELEN PIERCE** and **JANET SCOTT SWEET PEAS**, twenty-five pounds each **BURPEE'S ALLHEAD EARLY CABBAGE** and **BURPEE'S EARLIEST WAY-HEAD LETTUCE** and ten bushels **BURPEE'S STRINGLESS GREEN-POD BEAN**.

Our customers will find this a very inexpensive way of wiring their orders, but we must caution them that care be taken in writing out the messages, as we cannot hold ourselves responsible for errors arising from incomplete messages or incorrect translation.

IMPORTANT.—This telegraphic cipher must be used **ONLY** on orders by telegraph or cable, and never in written orders sent by mail.

The cipher or code-words given on this page are principally for our use in making quotations. For example:

Dab Cefalu Carding Davit, Tokay Bacon Demur, would mean: In reply to your telegram, we quote for immediate acceptance upon our usual terms for special quotations, provided unsold upon receipt of your order, one hundred pounds **BURPEE'S SUREHEAD CABBAGE** at \$1.00 per pound, two hundred bushels **EXTRA EARLY RED VALENTINE BEANS** at \$4.00 per bushel. These code-words can be used also if, when placing a telegraphic order, you wish to specify price quoted. For example:

Dare Angola Perturb Decanter Mocha Binate Diazo, meaning: Ship at once by freight, as per special quotations, five pounds **RUBY KING PEPPER** at \$2.00 per pound, sixteen bushels **FORDHOOK BUSH LIMA BEAN** at \$7.50 per bushel.



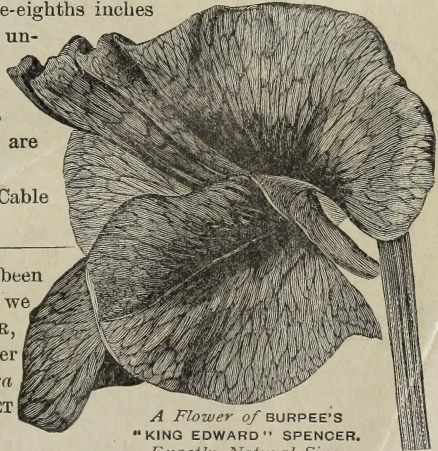
