

Certificate of Nursery Inspection, No. 87

Season, 1912-1913

THIS IS TO CERTIFY, That in accordance wish an Act of the Legislature approved April 17, 1905, the nursery grounds of J. C. Hale Nursery Company, at Winchester, County of Franklin, State of Tennessee, were inspected by C. R. Spangler and J. E. Blake on August 30, 1912. The growing nursery stock was apparently from San-Jose Scale and other dangerously injurious insect pests and plant diseases.

Said Nursery is equipped for fumigating all nursery stock.

This certificate has reference to insects and diseases, and is not otherwise to be considered as an endorsement of the parties to whom issued; it does not apply to stock not grown in the aforesaid nurseries unless such stock is covered by proper certificate in favor of the nursery where grown. It is not transferable and may be revoked for cause.

Said certificate becomes invalid after August 1, 1913, and cannot be legally used after that date.

Terms, Rates and Shipping Instructions

SHIPPING—Please give shipping directions, whether by freight or express; also route. When no route is designated, we exercise our best judgment without assuming any responsibility, after goods are packed, except for our own mistakes.

TERMS—Cash or satisfactory reference before shipment. To responsible, prompt-paying parties, we extend the usual time.

PACKING—We have had years of experience in packing and pride ourselves in that particular, having shipped peach trees to far-away Italy, and they arrived at their destination in fine condition. We use tight paper-lined boxes, and pack with moss and shingle-toe. Usual charges for boxing and packing.

CLAIMS—All claims for errors, shortage in count, or bad condition of stock on arrival must be made within ten days after receipt of goods, which will be promptly corrected if our fault; but old stale claims coming in after the above date will not be considered by us.

CAUTION—All orders are accepted on condition that they shall be void should any injury befall the stock from frost, hail, fire, or other causes beyond our control.
