

Cabbage, Copenhagen Market

The best of all early Cabbages. Stands longer without bursting than other early sorts. Everyone familiar with Cabbage knows the old and popular Danish Ballhead, the best of all the late Cabbages. This new extraearly variety, ripening with Charleston Wakefield, also originated in Denmark, and is as good, in its class, as the old favorite Danish Ballhead. The stem is short, the head round and solid. When ready for cutting, Copenhagen Market is the heaviest of the extra-early varieties, and if left until fully mature, frequently weighs eight to ten pounds. The leaves are small, compact and close to the head, so it will stand close planting. The inside is fine-grained, tender, pure white and compact. Will become a leader in the home garden and market. 

BEANS BUSH, DWARF, GREEN-PODDED

HARICOTS Grünschotige Buschbohnen Fagiuoli

- BLACK VALENTINE. Without a doubt the most popular market-gardeners' sort. Very early, perfectly round, without saddle back; long, round pod, about one-third longer than Red Valentine; an enormous cropper; both for early and late plantings. Qt. 30 cts., pk. \$2, bus. \$7.





These are placed in sand in a cellar, upright, about 2 inches apart and forced, the growth somewhat resembling Cos lettuce, which is considered a splendid winter salad. 



CULTURE .- Mushrooms are easily grown, with a little care and attention, under a spare shed, portion of a cellar, or any dark, dry place. Collect a quantity of fresh horse droppings. throw them into a heap, leaving it until it commences to ferment, then turn it over and mix it up well, and place it where you intend to make the bed, spread it regularly about 18 inches thick, tread firmly and level the bed. Leave this to heat for a few days and as soon as the heat drops to 90 degrees make holes in the bed, about a foot apart each way, into which put pieces of the spawn about the size of an egg, fill up the holes with the compost. Beat the surface well, afterward keep it dry, and the mushrooms will make their appearance in about five or six weeks. When the first crop has been taken, give the bed a good watering, leaving it as before, when they again will make their appearance. Beds can be made at any time of the year, and as one declines another should be made, to keep a constant supply. The spawn should be kept in a cool, dry place. When gathering, remove the stalks; do not cut them or they will rot and breed maggots.

SELECT FLORISTS' GLADIOLI

The Gladiolus today ranks in premier position of the spring-flowering bulbs. The demand for the flowers in early spring months has led to the florist forcing them from April to June, planting them largely among carnations and enjoying a double crop out of the house.

To extend the flowering season they should be planted successively in batches from January, care being taken not to have a too high temperature for early forcing-50 degrees at night and 60 degrees during the day is considered best. It requires from 10 to 12 weeks to bring the Gladiolus into bloom. Many florists plant them in flats in April and remove to coldframe when they have made roots about I inch long; in this way they get flowers about a month in advance of those planted in the open.

Mulch and water liberally, when well advanced in growth, but during early stages only when dry and then only sparingly.
