## Late-Flowering Tulips

ON pages 12 and 13 of this book are offered an up-to-date list of late-flowering Tulips, including Darwins, Cottage Garden, Rembrandt and Breeder Tulips. All of these are highly desirable for planting out doors for a supply of spring cut flowers, while many of the Darwin sorts are suitable for forcing. The florist who has store trade, or who delivers his flowers to the retailer who has a fancy trade, will make money from these. If forced, they require only a moderate heat; they should not be treated like early-flowering forcing tulips. The shades of color produced by the late-flowering tulips in many cases cannot be duplicated in any other class. The stems are 18 to 24 inches long, which makes them a valuable flower for cutting. Be sure and include some of them in your order.

### IMPORTANT NOTICE

Few florists realize the importance of placing their orders early. This avoids many disappointments. Many wait until the season is well advanced, which makes it impossible to always procure the varieties desired. WE repeat—ORDER EARLY—the best time is on receipt of this catalog.

**BUSINESS TERMS**—We especially invite Charge Accounts. A charge account is more convenient than to remit for each order at the time it is sent us; you pay no more for your goods by reason of this accommodation. As to our responsibility, we refer you to *Dun's* or *Bradstreet's Mercantile Agency*.

When sending your first charge order, refer preferably to some one in either your own or our line of business with whom you have a charge account. This saves many a delay. When sending us your first order accompanied by remittance, we prefer cashier's check or money order, unless cash is sent. This frequently also saves delays.

**Net Cash Items**—Grain, Clover, Bird and Farm Seeds, also Fertilizers, are handled on close margins and sold with no cash discounts.

**Discounts**—On bills for Flower, Vegetable Seeds and Bulbs, a discount of 2% for payment 10 days from receipt of bill may be deducted, if cash accompanies the order 3% may be deducted on such items. All other goods are strictly net, as are also bills for goods supplied under special quotation unless otherwise agreed upon.

All contracts and acknowledgments are contingent upon crop failures, partial deliveries by growers or manufacturers, strikes, or other unavoidable causes beyond our control, also unsatisfactory credit standing. All quotations are subject to market changes and goods being unsold on receipt of order. Henry F. Michell Company endeavors to send out only the very best quality of Seeds, Bulbs and Plants, but cannot guarantee results or crops. If customers do not accept goods on the above conditions, they may be returned to us within ten days.

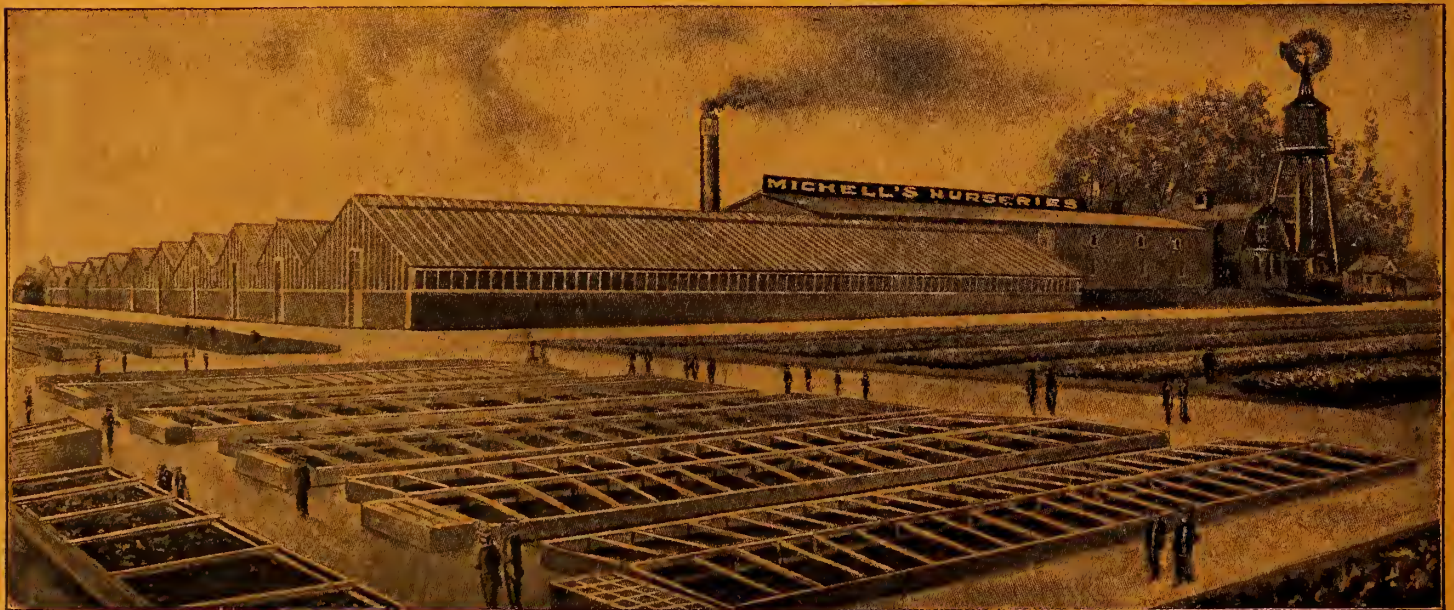
**Transportation Advantages Possessed by Philadelphia—**

**Freight.** Philadelphia's transportation facilities are unsurpassed by any other city in the U. S. The Pennsylvania R. R., Philadelphia & Reading R. R., Lehigh Valley R. R. and the B. & O. R. R. all have terminals in Philadelphia. These lines offer special facilities and quick transportation to any part of the U. S. Several of them touch with their own lines extreme North, South and West. Where they do not run direct, they have traffic agreements with connecting lines.

**Boat Connections.** The Clyde Line S. S. Co. and the Merchants & Miners S. S. Co. sail direct from Philadelphia for points as far south as Jacksonville, and the connections they have with the Mallory Line serve other extreme southern points. The Merchants & Miners Line also sails direct from Philadelphia to Boston, from where it serves points in New England. Boat transportation affords one of the quickest and most economical ways in existence to-day for shipping goods.

**Express Service.** Philadelphia is served by express service of the Adams, Wells-Fargo, and American Express Companies, which reach every part of the U. S. Goods consigned to any point on their lines can be forwarded without transfer. Express rates are extremely moderate, compared to what they were, and we recommend this service, where quick delivery is wanted and especially for the transportation of plants and other perishable goods. Seeds, Plants and Bulbs enjoy a special express rate, lower than what is demanded for carrying general merchandise.

**Parcel Post.** This method provides a quick, reasonably safe and inexpensive transportation of such goods as will be accepted by Parcel Post, such as flower, vegetable, grass and field seeds and many sundries; liquid preparations cannot be mailed with safety. In most instances the weight of articles is noted in this catalog, so that it will be necessary for you to figure the postage between the zone you reside in and Philadelphia. Most any Postmaster will furnish you free with a table of rate postage applicable from where you reside, also the weight limits that apply to Parcel Post.

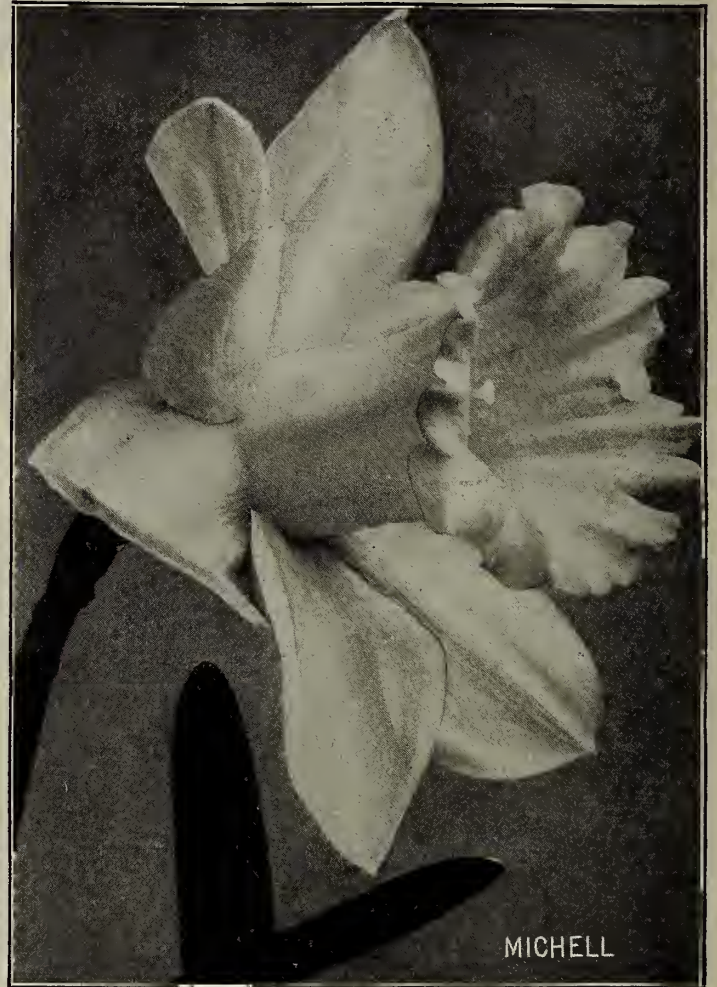

### CULTURAL NOTE ON PAEONIES

Autumn is one of the best times for planting. The soil should be well enriched with well-rotted manure. The roots should be set about 3 feet apart in rows, the latter 4 feet apart, to enable them to be cultivated with horse machines. The crowns should not be set more than 4 inches below the top of the soil; deeper planting may mean fewer flowers, sometimes none. Cultivate them freely, prior to and after the flowering season. In the spring, as soon as the ground can be worked, plow or work in a heavy coating of well-rotted manure.

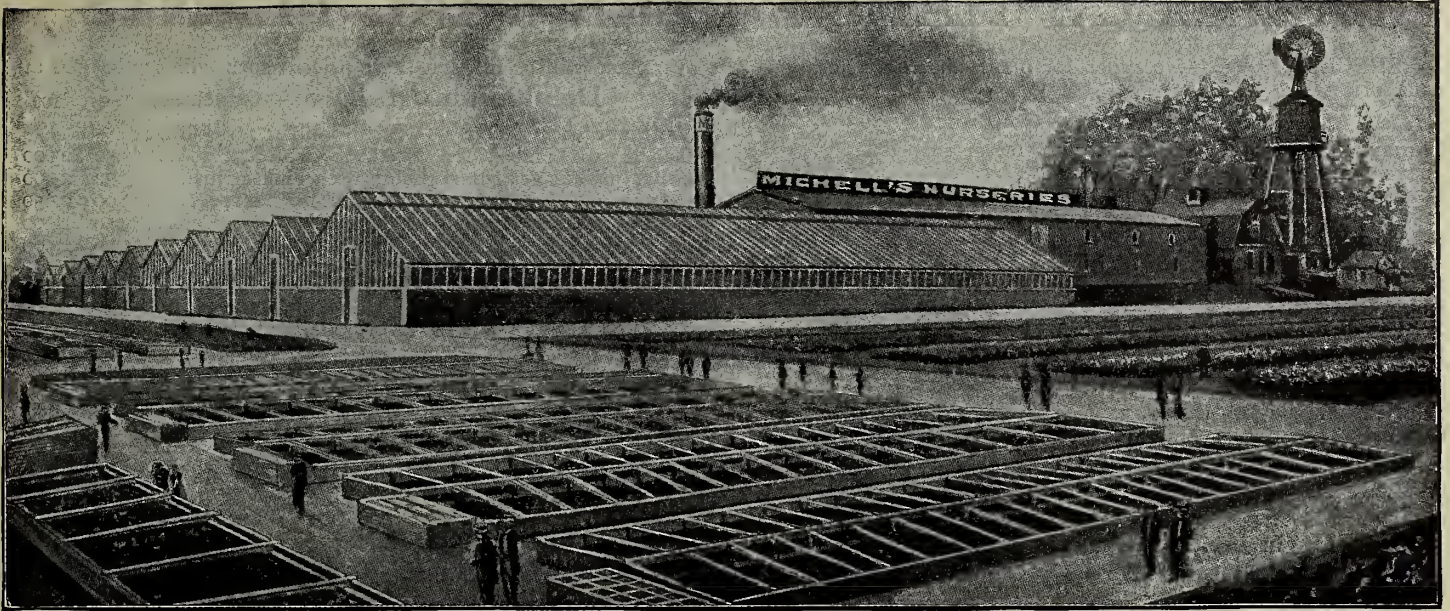
