Prices-At the prices quoted herein, 5 will be furnished at ten rates, 25 at hundred rates, and 250 at thousand rates.

Prices are limited to the spring of 1916, and are subject to change without notice.
Packing-Prices do not include packing. Packing carefully done in boxes, mostly, sometimes in bales or parcels, for which we charge moderately; for large boxes, 8 or 9 feet by $21-2$, three of which usually hold 1,0005 to 6 feet apple- $\$ 3.00$ each, and in proportion for larger or smaller boxes. NO CHARGE FOR DELIVERING AT RAILROAD, EXPRESS OR POSTOFFICE HERE. On lots by mail, postage and packing extra.
