Owing to the fact that employing agents increases the cost of stock 50 to 60 per cent., this Price List is our only salesman.

Planting the famous P. O. I. Co. trees and plants is a money-saving proposition, for we sell to you direct at wholesale or less than one-half agent's prices. No matter how large or how small your order may be, it will have our personal attention, plus the famous P. O. I. Co. quality and service.

## READ CAREFULLY

CONFLDENCE of our patrons has been won by sending exactly what they order, "true to name" and up to grade trees and plants. To those unacquainted we can only say a trial will prove their value and make you one of our many patrons.

OUR FRUIT TREES are grown at an elevation of more than 1600 feet above sea level. They are hardy, healthy, vigorous trees and plants of the famous P. O. I. Co. quality, and are all budded from fruiting orchards of merit.

OUR GUARANTEE. We guarantee all trees and plants sold by us to be true to name, free from all diseases and to reach customers in good growing condition. If any stock shculd prove otherwise, we hold ourselves in readiness to replace such stock free of charge or refund purchase price paid for same, this being the liquidation of all damages.

OUR SHIPPING SEASON for Spring opens about March 10 th to later part of May. September 1st to December 1st for Fall.

AMOUNT OF ORDER. Owing to the fact that we are wholesale nurserymen and sell direct to customers, it is impossible for us to take orders for less than $\$ 1.50$. Therefore, on smaller orders add 25 cents extra for packing, billing of order, etc. This does not apply to Bulbs, Hardy Perennials, Cannas, Dahlias, Iris, Strawberry Plants or Evergreens, as orders for same we will put up regardless of size.

TERMS are cash with order or satisfactory references. Then onethird cash must accompany order, balance payable on delivery. Remember we guarantee satisfaction or money refunded. You take no chances.

HOW TO REMIT. P. O. money order, express money order, personal checks or drafts payable to the Property Owners' Improvement Company. When remittance is sent in the above methods we guarantee it to reach us.

PACKING AND BOXING. We do not make any extra charge for this work when orders are for more than $\$ 1.50$.
prices quoted in this price list are f. o. b. FREIGHt, EXPRESS OFFICE OR ABOARD CARS PENLLIN, PA.

SPECIAL DISCOUNT. On all cash orders received not later than March 25 th we will give a cash discount of 10 per cent. This applies to Fruit Trees, Small Fruits, Shrubs, Roses and Evergreens only. If your order does not amount to $\$ 4.00$ get your friends to order with you and we will put the orders up separate, but ship in the same box or bale. This discount will more than pay the freight on your order. No discounts on collections.

GRADING. We guarantee every tree and plant up to grade specified, or better. Many times trees are sold by height only. This we believe to be very misleading, as we have seen trees which belonged to the second
or third class (if graded by size and caliper) sold for first grade, as they had the required height. We grade and sell our trees by height and caliper both, and believe this to be the only way that gives entire satisfaction to the planter.

Below are freight charges from Penllyn to points stated below. In most cases the freight will cost you less than one-third cent per tree.

It is impossible to give a more definite estimate as some varieties weigh more than others, on account of the difference in the density of the wood growth. For instance, a Peach Tree would weigh less than a Pear Tree of exactly the same size. The above, however, will enable you to make a close estimate as to the freight rate on a given amount of stock.

The railroads bill all small freight shipments weighing 100 pounds each, even though the actual weight be less, and no shipments for less than 25 cents.
