ADVICE AND TERMS.

PLEASE READ CAREFULLY BEFORE ORDERING.

YOUR NAME, POSTOFFICE and STATE should be distinctly written, and be sure that neither is omitted. We receive many letters, and sometimes remittances, with either signature, postoffice or state omitted. Always give full name and address of Agriculture.

ALWAYS USE THE ORDER SHEET in making out your order, and not mix your order and letter together on same sheet. YOUR CHOICE of sorts always, but, if you so request, we will make selections, using our best judgment. When orders cannot be filled to the letter, we exercise our judgment as to sending as nearly similar sorts as possible, or another size of the variety wanted. When it is desired that I shall not do this, it must be so stated in the order. Simply affix the words "No Substitution."

PAYMENTS INVARIABLY IN ADVANCE. Goods are sent C. O. D. only when 25 per cent. of the amount is sent with order, with return charges added. Remit by Postal Money Order, Registered Letter, Draft or Express Money Order. Always enclose remittance in same letter with order. Address all letters to Herman H. Kellner, Keystone Nurseries, Danbury, Conn.

SHIPPING INSTRUCTIONS. State positively when ordering, how we are to ship, whether by Freight, Express, or Mail. If by Freight or Express, give name of R. R. Station and your Postoffice too. If by Mail your Postoffice only. Do not forget postage. If you desire shipped by a special route, specify this also. I deliver all goods to forwarders here without charge, after which my control ceases; consequently, my responsibility also. Transportation charges on all goods shipped by freight or express are to be paid by the purchaser. Nothing by mail at thousand rates.

THE ARTICLES LISTED will be furnished at the prices quoted on list when the quantity specified shall be taken. Five hundred will be furnished at the Thousand rate; Fifty at the Hundred rate; Five at the rate per ten. Single Plants at Net Prices. Keep a correct copy of the order and check off the Trees, Plants, etc., when they arrive. Persons sometimes forget what they order and make unjust complaint.

GUARANTEE.—We warrant our stock true to name, with the express understanding that should any not prove so, we will refund the money paid or replace it with other stock, but are not liable for damages beyond this. Claims, if any, must be made on receipt of goods, when they will be carefully and cheerfully examined, and if just, all made satisfactory. Claims made after 15 days from receipt of goods will not be entertained. I send out only good stock in good condition, carefully packed in all cases; but success or failure depends in so large a degree upon the care and management after received, that I do not, because I cannot, undertake to guarantee stock to live. Everything is labelled.

ESTIMATES.—During the busy season, making estimates consumes too much time. This list is compiled for the purpose of saving time; order from it.
