

These seeds are described in our Catalogue. Prices are for immediate acceptance only, and subject to being unsold. Price List is changed about once a week, usually on Saturdays. Samples sent upon application. BAGS—On seeds marked 1, jute bags are free with any amount purchased but are weighed in gross for net. On seeds marked 2, bags are free up to bushel lots (weighed in, gross for net), but in bu. lots and above add 30c. each for seamless bags. Seeds marked 3, can be safely shipped in 2 bu. cotton bags for which we charge 15c. each. Seeds marked "b" are shipped in heavy cheap seamless sacks at 24c each. Corn bags or crates free. All Shipments double sacked add 30 cents for extra bag.

* Alfalfa, Southwestern hardy. This is non-irrigated and unusually good seed. Would recommend it freely for all states south of the Ohio River.

† RAPE, Dwarf Essex, English. Offered subject to arrival of stock.

** SOYS, all other varieties, includes this year the Jet, Extra Select Sable, Mongol, Mikado, Wilson, Ito San, Early Brown, and we will probably have the Morse. We do not expect to have any Medium Green and perhaps not any Mammoth this year. The Early Brown very closely recembles Ito San. Practically they are of equal value and adapted to the same uses. The Morse is a grain variety that compares well with the Mongol and Mikado.

*** CORN, Blue Ridge Ensilage, we will sell shelled and graded only. This Corn comes to us direct from a Virginia grower of good reputation. Our purchase sample shows excellent germination, but since we do not grow and cure the Corn ourselves, we cannot give this a 98 per cent germination guarantee as we do on our own Corn. These remarks also apply to Long-fellow Flint Corn.

We give below prices on two types of Corn which are rejected by the grader. The "pumpkin seed" type should work satisfactorily in an edge-drop planter, but the grains are too broad to be symmetrical. The "square" type Corn is not fit for any edge-drop planter. In fact, it is just the type of Corn that will not work in this machine. It is square and irregular shaped grains from the center of the ear, not off the butts and tips. We have limited amounts of oth these types of Corn in every variety that we handle except the too Day White. We think they should be used for silage purposes only, although Minn. 13 might be drilled for hogging purposes. It is all well bred Corn, well cared for, and we will guarantee a germination of 95 per cent in it:

Corn, "Pumpkin Seed Type," all varieties.....56lbs. 2.60. 5 bu. 2.55. 10 bu. 2.50 Corn, "Square Type," all varieties.......56lbs. 1.35. 5 bu. 1.30. 10 bu. 1 25

We believe Wing's Corn to be the best in the state. Our belief is strengthened by the fact that this Corn has won the State Championship in the Junior Contests three times; twice with our 120 Day Yellow, and once, including the 1916 Contest-just ended, with our Improved White Cap. In the 1916 Contest no other plot anywhere near equaled that of Dewey Hanes, who won with Wing's Improved White Cap.
