Count Zeppelin.—Beautiful shade of light vermilion.

Emmanuel Arena.—Deep rich velvet crimson, maculated orange red.

FEUER.—Brilliant crimson-red flower.

Granville.—An attractive shade of deep rose pink, with white blotches on upper petals.

Jean Pabon.—Blood red, small white eye.

Mrs. E. G. Hill.—An exquisite shade of soft, light salmon.

Mrs. E. Rawson.—Bright scarlet, with crimson shading on upper petals.

Pamela.—A pure white centre, shading through a maculated effect to a broad, distinct, outer margin of crimson lake.

Princess Alex.—Pleasing shade of a bright carmine lake.

RIVAL.—A unique soft shade of salmon-red, upper petals beautifully blotched.

Rosalda.—Rich crimson pink; upper petals heavily blotched white.

Teodor de Wyzewa.—Cheerful, clear shade of a clear lilac rose.

Tiffin.—An effective shade of rich, glowing scarlet, crimson shading on upper petals.

Ivy-leaved.

ALPHA.—The foliage is finely denticulated. The centre of the leaf is greenish maize, with a broad dark zone, edged golden yellow; free-flowering, of a rich shade of scarlet red. Single flowers, medium size, abundantly produced in fair size trusses.

Alliance.—A hybrid between a Zonal and Ivy. Its color is a most exquisite shade of delicate lilac white, upper petals feathered and blotched bright crimson rose.

BALLADE.—Tender lilac; upper petals feathered with crimson maroon.

CAESAR FRANK.—Soft rich crimson, with an exquisite shading of tender rose at the base of petals.

Col. Baden Powell.—Color varies at times from pearl white to soft blush, blotched crimson.

Countess de Grey.—A pleasing shade of light satiny salmon.

HECTOR GAICOMELLE.—An exquisite shade of lavender white, effective tinted pale rose, upper petals distinctly feathered crimson maroon, lower petals touched with same color.

INCOMPARABLE.—Exquisite shade of rose carmine.

JAMES T. HAMILTON.—A hybrid, intense carmine crimson, long stout stems, good for bedding or pot work.

Joseph Warren.—Lovely rich, purple rose color, slightly feathered dark maroon.

Mrs. Banks.—Color a pleasing shade of blush white, upper petals feathered reddish Nevron.

Pierre Crozy.—Bright scarlet, handsome and delicate finish.

· Variegated Foliage Varietics.

Mrs. Pollock.—Attractive orange-red flowers, beautiful foliage, very distinct markings, bright bronze red zone, belted with crimson, edged with golden vellow.

MME. SALLEROI.—Makes a round pretty plant, about one foot high and wide, foliage bright green, edged with pure white, dwarf, compact grower.

Scented Leaved Varieties.

CAPITATUM.—Small cut leaf; rose scented.

FAIR ELLEN.—Large oak-leaved foliage, fragrant and beautiful.

Felicifolium Odoratum.—Very attractive on account of its beautiful fern-like foliage, both as a plant and when used among flowers, a great favorite.

LADY MARY.—Upper petals rose lake shaded violet crimson. Lower petals blush white, small flowers, very pleasing odor.

Mrs. Kingsbury.—Magenta crimson, shading lighter to white eye, upper petal veined maroon. Sweet-scented foliage.

OAK-LEAVED.—Leaves somewhat resembling those of an oak tree, dark chocolate centre.

PHEASANT'S FOOT.—Large foliage.

QUERCIFOLIUM.—Oak-leaved foliage, leaf black centre, attractive.

Rose.—The standard rose-scented, a favorite since it was introduced.
