PLEASE READ.

This Price List contains a number of varieties of Irises and Peonies and Perennials not listed in our 1921 Catalogue. We will issue a new catalogue early in 1922 of Irises, Peonies, Gladioli and Perennial Plants.

Make your selections from this list early. We begin shipping Irises in July and continue through August, September and October. We ship Peonies only in September and October, and Oriental Poppies in August. Other perennials are best planted in the Fall. early enough to get established before winter. All newly planted stock should be lightly mulched the first winter to prevent heaving.

In describing irises S. means standard or upright petals, and F. means falls or drooping petals. Terms: Cash with the order. All shipments will be made by express unless otherwise instructed. If shipment by parcel post is desired, for irises add 5 cents for the first plant and 5 cents for each additional three plants. For peonies and perennials add 5 cents for each plant.
