While this Guide is primarily intended for California conditions, it can also be easily adapted to the Northern States by making a suit able allowance for climatic conditions. In most instances a few weeks later than the planting times given here is sufficient.

## January

Flower Garden_ms next month will be a busy month it is lected and the ground all spaded up. Have a derinite plan of wha you are to plant and where it is to be planted. In other words, la you your garden in detail before beginning to sow your seeds. When out your garde ina dere well into the soil. Some of the Bulbs planted in the fall should be blooming during this month; in fact, a January garden is mainly dependent on this form of flowers. Commence planting the following Bulbs: Dahlias form of flowers, Commence planting the following Bulbs: Dahlias Gloxinia (house plant), Tuheroses, Caladum, Madeira Vine Root, Cin namon Vine and Mystery Bulb. Continue planting the following Bulbs: Agapanthus, Amaryllis (Beliadonna), Amarylis (Johnsonii), Anemones, Bleeding Heart, Crocus, Cyclamen, Freesia, Dafrodil, Giad oli, Hyacinths, Roman Hyacinths, Ixias, Jonquil, Japanese Lilies, Japanese Iris, Tiger Lily, Easter Lilies, Calla Lily, Narcissus, Paeo nies, Ranunculus, Snowdrops, Sparaxis, Spanish Iris, Spirea, Tulips, Lily-of-the-Valley. If Sweet Peas are planted this month the roots will be stronger and the blossoms more profuse than if planted later. All deciduous shrubs and evergreens can now be planted.

## February

Flower Garden-Commence planting Tuberous Begonia Amaryllis (Belladonna) Auns and continue planting Agapanthus, Amaryllis (Johnsonii), Anemones, Crocus yclamen, Dahlias, Dielytra, Gladiolus, Gloxinia, Hyacinths, Japanese Lilies, Tiger Lilies, Easter Lily, Calla Lily, Narcissus, Paeonies, Ra nunculus, Snowdrops, Sparaxis, Tuberoses, Daffodil, Japanese Iris, Spanish Iris, Tulips, Caladium, Madeira Vine, Cinnamon Vine, Lily of-thc-Valley, Spirea Japonica and Mystery Bulbs.

For spring, summer and autumn flowers this month should find ou busy beginning to sow flower seeds, including the following: Abronia, Abutilon, Acrolinium, Ageratum, Agrostis, Alyssum, Ama. ranthus, Ammobium, Anagallis, Argemone Decorative Asparagus, Asters, Australian Pca Vine, Australian Star Flower, Bachelors Butine, Balsam, Bartonia Aurea, Scarlet Runner Bean, Begonia, Bignonia, Boston Ivy, Brachycombe, Cactus, Calendula, Calcolaria, Calliopsis, Campanula, Canary Bird Vine, Candytuft, Canna, Carnation, Centaurea, Clcmatis Paniculata, Clarkia, Cobea Scandens, oleus, Coreopsis, Cosmos, Cubhea, Cyperus Alternifolius. ## March

Flower Carden=- Continue planting Bulbs as follows: Aga Cyclamen, Dahlias, Dielytra, Gladiolus, Gloxinia, Japanese Lilies, Tiger Lily, Easter Lily, Calla Lily, Paeonies, Tuberoses, Japanese Iris Caladium, Madeira Vine, Cinnamon Vine, Lily-of-the-Valley, Spirea Japonica and Mystery Bulb.
It is now time to commence planting the following flower seeds; Byronopsis, Castor Bean, Celosia, Cockscomb, Globe Amaranth and Ice Plant. Besides this continue planting Annual, Biennial and Perennial Flower Seeds which are included in directions for the February flower garden, all of which may be planted during the month of March. Look after slugs, bugs and weeding.

## April

Flower Garden_There are still quite a goodly number of his month, and are: Agapanthus, Amaryllis (Iohnsonii) Tuberous Be Caladium, Madcira Vine, Ginnanion Viae, Lily-of-the-Valley and Spirea Japonica.

Among the flower seeds that you should commence planting ane the different ornamental Gourds. Nearly all flower seeds may le planted during April; in fact all of those listed under the February calendar, except Centaureas. Watch for the bugs and keep the weed down. Watch your Rose Busuzs, :nd is troubled with igreer aphis use tobacco wash freely.

## May

Flower Carden This month you may still eontinue plant Gloxinia, Paeonies, Tuberose, Caladium, Madeira Vine, Cinnamon Vine
and Spirea Japonica Bulbs. All flower seeds given in the February calendar should be planted except Arcolinium, Centaurea, Phlox and Rhodanthe. Gourds may be planted this month.

When Hyacinths, Tulips and other bulbs die down, dig them up and store away in a cool, dry place until fall, when they may be re planted. The vacant places thus created should be filled with Dahlias, Petunias, Pansies, Salvias and other flowering plants.

## June

> Flower Garden_Continuc planting Dahlias, Gladiolus, Pae leira Vine and Cinnamon Vine Bulbs. But very few flower seeds should be planted during this month, these few including Gourds Hyacinth Bean, Portulaca, Sweet Peas, Byronopsis, Scarlet Runner Beans, Candytuft, Canna, Castor Bean, Celosia and Cockscomb.

There are many varieties of flower seeds that can be planted this month, including Cineraia, Clematis, Centaurea, oreopsis, Cyperus, Alternifolius, Delphinium, Dianthus, Eschscholt ia, Forget-Me-Not, Feverfew, Foxglove, Gaillardia, Godetia, Golden Feather, Golden Rod, Gypsophila, Hollyhock, Lupin, Mignonette, Mar guerite Carnation, Marigold, Phlox, Pansies, Pinks, Polyanthus, Sal iglossis, Scabiosa, Smilax, Snapdragon, Stocks, Sweet William, Violets, Verbena, Wallflower, Asparagus (decorative), Cactus Calendula Calceolaria, Calliopsis, Campanula, Candytuft, Carnation Catch flydula Celosia. Caterpillars are plentiful this month, and should be kept of plants and flowers.

## September

Flower Carden Commence planting Amaryllis (Bella Crocus, Ixias, Jonquils, Lupin, Mignonette, Marigold, Marguerite Carnation, Poppies, Verbena, Narcissus, Clematis, Daffodil, Roman Hyacinths, Spanish Iris, Snowdrops and Tulips. Also continue plant ing Cineraria, Centaurea, Cyclamen, Clematis, Freesia, Roman Hyainths, Violets, St. Joseph Lily and Calla Lily. All flower seeds given August calendar may be freely planted during September, besides which commence planting Columbine, Daisies, Honeysuckle, Abronia, Abutilon, Alyssum, Anagalis, Argemone, Australian Pea Vine, Bachelors Button and Boston Ivy. If Sweet Peas are planted during Sep tember, October, November and December they will have a good buttom growth in the spring and will carry more and bigger blossonis

## October

Flower Garden_Bulbs should be planted heavily this lanting Agapanthus, Gladiolii Hyacinths an ideal time to commence ris, Easter Lilies, Paeonies, Rununculus Japarese Lilies, lapanese planting Amaryllis (Belladonna), Amaryllis Saraxis; also continue Crocus, Cyclamen, Freesia, Roman Hyacinths, Ixias, Jonquils, St Joseph Lily, Calla Lily, Snowdrops, Narcissus, Daffodil, Tulips and Spanish Iris.

They are bright red in color and have a very rich, full flavor. The Magoon is especially good where hard winters are the rule-as it will stand the most trying weather.

## STRA WBERRY CULTURE

The ground should be prepared by digging or plowing about 12 inches deep. The soil should be well enriched with thoroughly rotted stable manure or ground bone, or any other good tertilizer and worked thoroughly in the soil. Make the beds about 3 feet wide, so as to accommodate 3 rows of plants. The plants should be set 15 inches apart each way. Don't allow running plants to set closer han 4 inches after the plants begin to send out runners.

The plants must have ample room to build up. Keep the soil around your plants well loosened and never allow the soil to get hard around the young plants. Hoe often.

The ground should be plowed, fertilized and hoed four times during the season.
