## Burnett's Giant Darwin Tulips

These wonderful tulips bloom in May after the early tulips, hyacinths and narcissi are over, and continue for from two to three weeks until the peony commences to unfold its petals.

To thoroughly enjoy their great wealth of beauty, and their stateliness, as they carry their giant flowers erect on tall stems, they should be planted in masses of at least 50 of a kind in open beds, or in wide borders close to a hedge, fence, shrubbery or residence, in fact anywhere that affords a background to show off their wonderful shades. They are also extremely effective planted among the perennials in the herbaceous border in colonies of 12 or more bulbs of a kind, where they can be left undisturbed for two or three years. Plant 4 to 5 ins. deep and 6 ins. apart.
