

Valuable for Cattle, Sheep and Hogs

This is a highly valuable forage and should be fed by all who grow This is a highly valuable forage and should be fed by all who grow any kind of live stock for food purposes. Under favorable conditions it is ready for pasturing sheep or cattle within six weeks from time of sowing, and on an average 1 acre will carry twelve to fifteen sheep or hogs six weeks to two months. When on the rape they should at times have access to salt, but water is not necessary. In the Northern States it should be sown from April to end of August for fall pasturing, but as it thrives best in cool weather, it should not be sown in the Southas it thrives best in cool weather, it should not be sown in the south-ern States until September or October for winter pasture. In the latitude of Philadelphia it should be sown in April, or in July or August. Its fattening properties are probably twice as good as those of clover, and for sheep the feeding value of rape excels all other plants we know of. At the Michigan Experiment Station, 128 lambs were pastured for eight weeks on 15 acres of rape, sown in July, and showed a gain of 2,800 lbs., at the rate of 3 lbs. per lamb each week. 




Fig. 76, showing the Double Wheel Hoe set up as a single Wheel "Iron Age" Double Wheel Hoe
