

Carpet Grass.

Strictly a pasture grass, and specially adapted to light or sandy soils near the Coast or Gulf sections. It is capable of being very closely grazed or trampled, and in fact seems to do better when trampled. It has a creeping habit of growth which enables it to spread rapidly when close grazed. When a patch once becomes established, it spreads very rapidly, and on a well trampled field, a good sod will be established in two years. It is best seeded in the Spring, and attains its best development during the Summer and Fall. It seeds in September and October, and while it cannot be depended on to give very much if any green feed during the Winter, frost and cold does not kill it. It needs sunshine for its best growth. There is little danger of grazing it too closely, and a good carpet grass pasture will support as much stock as a good blue grass pasture.
