Beware of Imported Red Clover

Because of the short crop of domestic Seed, much imported Red Clover will be offered for sale in this country the coming season. In our opinion any farmer who plants imported Red Clover is facing a chance of heavy loss. It has been shown that some imported Red Clover looks as well or better than domestic Red Clover, its germination is practically as good, and it will make a good seeding the first Spring. But the damage is done by winter killing the first Winter. Wherever you buy your seed, always insist on knowing the original source and remember that imported seed can be bought at \$2.00 to \$4.00 per 100 lbs. less than choice domestic. We are offering only the finest grade of domestic northern Idaho grown Red Clover of better than 99.50% purity.

Alfalfa

We find that there is a very short crop of alfalfa seed in the United States this year, and the greater part of this seed crop is Southwestern-grown on irrigated land, and hence entirely unsuitable for New York, Pennsylvania and the New England States.

The Alfalfa seed we are offering is Northern Idaho dry land grown, dodder free, and is better than 99.50% pure. We are purposely not handling Montana-grown alfalfa this year as we could find no seed in that state which was free from dodder, or was of our high quality. This statement excepts the Grimm, of which we have one small lot Growers Guaranteed Grimm Montana dry land grown, and dodder free.

Alsike

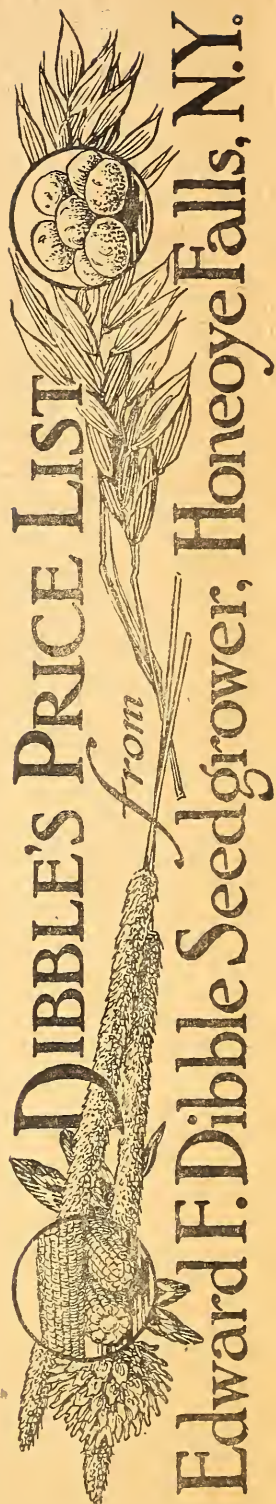
The domestic Alsike crop was not large this year, but importations from Canada have been about a third more in quantity than was imported during the same period last year. Some of the seed is of very inferior quality. Fortunately we were able to obtain some very choice Alsike testing 99% pure; to sell at a reasonable price.

Timothy

Latest reports show that while the domestic Timothy seed crop is nearly normal in quantity, heavy export demand has already raised the lower grades of Timothy to higher prices than prevailed for the high grades last year.

Our present Lot "D" contains better than 20% Alsike; less than 1% weed seeds; balance of mixture choice Timothy. Canada Field Peas

are a very light crop this year; one of the shortest in years. Prices will rule about like last year or slightly higher.

Oats

Since writing the inside front cover of our catalog nothing has changed our opinion that seed oats of our quality will command a premium but still will be worth the money we ask for them. During the past few weeks there has been a great demand by the big elevators for heavy oats to mix with light ones to bring up their weight. This as we predicted earlier has absolutely exhausted the supply of heavy oats in several sections so that even before the demand for seed begins, there is a distinct shortage. Ask for samples of our Seed Oats.

Barley

Good Seed Barley is in very short supply due to the extremely small crop this year but prices will rule slightly higher than last year's prices due to the generally higher prices on most food commodities.

Seed Corn

The Seed Corn situation is so serious and unusual that we have thought best to print a special circular, which accompanies this price list. It is our suggestion that you read the circular carefully, and act promptly, as it is very evident that prices for choice seed corn will surely advance as Spring draws near and the demand increases.

Insist on good Seed Corn. Demand germination test. Every bushel of Dibble's Seed Corn is northern grown, hardy, acclimated, suited to the peculiar conditions of Northern and Eastern Farmers and is not shipped until tested in our Laboratory. Each bag has a tag showing purity and germination test.

Seed Potatoes

should be bought intelligently. Good quality can be secured and at reasonable prices. Do not pay too little money for your Seed Potatoes and get poor, run-out, diseased stock. In many sections of the country, late blight and other serious diseases were prevalent. Dibble's Seed Potatoes are of the best quality and were saved from fields untouched by blight. Even this early in the season the supplies of some of our early varieties are practically exhausted. Advise buying now.
