How to Grow the "Roses of Newcastle"

Planting-Having been grown in the best rose-growing soil in the country, our plants have a decided advantage in being strong and sturdy when sent out. Being pot grown they can be planted at any time when the ground can be dug; but the best time in the greater part of the U. S. A. is after all frost is past. There is no set time. In climates similar to Indiana you may plant satisfactorily up until the first of July. Don't forget our plants are pot grown, and in full foliage and are not dormant leafless nursery grown plants such as are sold by traveling nursery agents. These latter plants can only be planted during March and April while they are dormant. More stock is lost from planting too early than from all other causes combined.

Select a sunny location for planting not close to large trees. Ordinary good garden soil will do. If available spade in liberal quantities of well-rotted cow or stable manure. Dig to a depth of about twelve inches. Set the bush roses about fifteen to eighteen inches apart. Put the roots well below the surface of the soil. Cover completely with soil, pressing it together firmly about the plant. Water thoroughly after you have planted them. Don't be afraid to soak the soil to the bottom of the roots. Then do not water again until the ground becomes pretty dry. Don't keep the plants watered all the time. A good drying out makes new roots. When the plants are received from us, place the roots in water for one-half hour or more before planting. After planting use newspapers to protect the plants from the direct rays of the sun for a few days. Plants may be kept clean, vigorous by syringing the foliage with water under high pressure. Insects may be prevented by use of the insecticides offered on this page.

Pruning—Roses should be cut back about one-half the previous year's growth. This should be done in the early spring before they have started into growth. After the plants bloom, if you so desire, cut the blooms and enjoy them. It does not hurt the plant in any way. If plants fail to mature the buds which they bear, remove some of the undeveloped buds and enrich the soil with Walker's Plant Food, Stim-U-Plant tablets, air-slacked lime, well-rotted cow manure.

Winter Protection—All roses are benefited by protection during the winter. Don't cover the plants until severe freezing weather, then cover them with leaves, hay, straw or similar material. Don't remove the covering in the spring until the weather is settled.



Jeannette Heller, will appear pure yellow, then again almost white, again deep pink; flowers will be lacking in petalage-Nature has her vagaries, but fortunately they are always beautiful. Labels are not sometimes attached to the right plants, but always the value is there and so is the rose, maybe bearing another label. We reserve the right to make substitutions giving another variety of equal value unless instructed to the contrary.


