For Florida and Georgia we recommend the Early Amber Sorghum as it is much earlier than the other varieties and gives a much heavier forage.

SORGHUM AND COW PEAS

We strongly urge our customers to make liberal seeding of Sorghum and Cow Peas as this makes a most nutritious Hay; the Sorghum will hold the Cow Peas up and make it much easier to cut, while the Sorghum in this way will not grow to such an extent to become tough and stalky. The crop should be cut when the Sorghum is just heading out, regardless of the condition of the Cow Peas. Sow at the rate of one bushel Cow Peas and a peck of Sorghum to the acre.
