## WE ESPECIALLY INVITE CHARGE ACCOUNTS

A charge account is more convenient than to remit for each order at the time it is sent us; you pay no more for your goods by reason of this accommodation. As to our responsibility, we refer you to Dun's or Bradstreet's Mercantile Agency or any bank or trust company.
When sending your first charge order, refer preferably to someone in either your own or our line of business with whom you have a charge account. This frequently saves delay.

## DISCOUNTS

On bills for Flower Seeds, Vegetable Seeds and Bulbs, a discount of 2 per cent. for payment 10 days from date of bill may be deducted; $5 \%$ cash discount is allowed on all orders of Flower Seeds and $3 \%$ cash discount on all orders of Vegetable Seeds and Bulbs when remittance accompanies the order, unless on items specially quoted or priced. Cash discount above does not apply to dealers orders, unless so stated in quotations or otherwise. All other goods are strictly net, as are also bills for goods supplied under special quotations unless otherwise agreed upon.

SPECIAL NOTICE.-We prepay postage free on all Flower and Vegetable Seeds offered in this Catalog, except on Peas, Beans, Corn and such other items as may be noted. We do not prepay free postage on Plants, Bulbs, Sundries, Tools, etc., nor do we prepay free any items on which we may have quoted special prices. All postage is charged on dealers orders regardless of items ordered.

PLEASE NOTE CHANGES IN POSTAL RATES.-On sundries or other merchandise (not including Seeds, Bulbs, Roots or Plants) not exceeding eight (8) ounces in weight, the postage charge is $11 / 2$ c. for each two (2) ounces or fraction thereof. On seeds, bulbs, roots, plants, sundries, etc., weighing over eight ( 8 ) ounces in addition to the regular postage, there is to be added an additional $2 c$. to each package as a service charge.

If Special Delivery is wanted an additional 10 c . is required on packages weighing up to two (2) pounds-15c. on packages weighing more than two (2) pounds and up to ten (10) pounds-20c. on packages weighing more than ten (10) pounds.

If it is desired that a package be given the same dispatch as first class mail it requires an additional 25 cents to the amounts as stated above, which is called a "Special Handling" rate.

If remittance accompanies order, a sufficient amount shouid be included to cover the extra charges-if ordered to be sent by either of the methods as stated above.
We do not make shipments of Plants or Cold Storage Bulbs C. O. D., and shipments of goods C. O. D. outside of our automobile delivery limits can only be made that way provided a partial remittance is sent with the order to guarantee that the goods will be accepted on arrival.

IMPORTANT NOTICE.-All shipments of plants, perishable stock and cold storage bulbs are made at buyers' risk only.
If such shipments arrive in bad condition, accept them and receipt for them accordingly, and make claim for your loss on the transportation company. We, of course, will hold ourselves ready to assist you in any possible way. It has been found that claims can be collected more readily by the person receiving the goods than by the shipper.

Our custom to guarantee the actual arrival of goods (except at points where there is no freight or express agent), will still be continued, and claims for loss or non-arrival of merchandise not perishable will, as in the past, be cared for by us, so you run no risk of having to make claims for lost goods.

## CONDITIONS OF SALES

All contracts, sales and acknowledgments of orders are contingent upon crop failures, partial deliveries by growers or manufacturers, strikes, or other unavoidable causes beyond our control, clerical errors included; also unsatisfactory credit standing. All quotations are subject to market changes and goods being unsold on receipt of order. Henry F. Michell Co. give no warranty, expressed or implied, as to the description, purity or productiveness of any seeds, plants or bulbs they send out, and they cannot be in any way responsible for the crop. If the customer does not accept the goods on these terms, he must notify us at once, and we will give instructions for disposition of goods. No responsible seedsman can give a warranty.

## SUGGESTIONS IN CONNECTION WITH THE

## GROWING OF HARDY LILIES UNDER GLASS

Many florists are of the belief that these can be forced rapidly like Giganteums; this is, however, not so. They should be grown more cool and be given a greater length of time in which to flower. It usually takes from 16 to 18 weeks from the time of planting to bring them into bloom, if the best results are to be obtained. In fact, if you can give them longer to come into flower it is better. Where they are forced with plenty of heat, the result is that you get good foliage with not so many blooms early. The latter is usually from a money making standpoint. We have particular reference to Lilium Magnificum, Melpomene, Rubrum and Album.

If it is desired to flower bulbous Iris under glass, on arrival flat them as you would Freesias, in light, sandy soil, bury them outdoors, covering with screened ashes or sand with sash off; leave them out until thoroughly rooted, but do not let them freeze ; bring them in normally about November 15 th and place them in a cool house-a carnation house temperature suits them best-allowing them to come into growth and flower slowly; under this treatment we believe better flowering results will be obtained. They generally under this method bloom in March or early April. They may also be planted in benches among carnations, but we believe American grown stock, which is all that is available, will give best results under the first prescribed method. Iris Tingitana and Filifolia may be handled in the same way. The Dutch and Spanish Iris are hardy for one season and may be planted outdoors in a sunny location, for spring cut flowers. The Tingitana and Filifolia varieties are not hardy in the latitude of Philadelphia.

## MICHELL'S MUSHROOM SPAWN

## PURE SPORE CULTURE SPAWN

Every florist and market gardener should grow mushrooms as a side line; they are very profitable and always find a ready sale. There is always some space under greenhouse benches or in boiler houses where mushrooms will grow; they require no special conditions that a greenhouse man cannot give and with the use of carton or bottle spawn seldom fail.

This spawn is made in quart milk jars under absolutely sterile conditions. The bottle and materials are sterilized under steam pressure of twelve pounds, so that every mold, weed seed or insect is destroyed and each bottle contains nothing but the pure spawn. The cost is not much more than brick spawn considering how much further it goes; each jar contains enough for 30 to 40 square feet. The sterile spawn is dried thoroughly and each piece wrapped in tissue paper and contains full instructions. There is a rapidly increasing demand for fresh mushrooms, just as there is for hot-house tomatoes and other greenhouse products; the price is always good and markets are usually nearby.
