

DIRECTIONS FOR ASPARAGUS CULTURE

SEED PLANTING—Asparagus may be raised from seed and a crop obtained in three years. In early Spring sow the seed, after soaking it twenty-four hours in warm water, in drills about one foot apart and one to two inches deep. The following Spring, select the best of the roots and place in the permanent bed.

BOOT PLANTING.

ROOT PLANTING—A year may be saved by buying the plants (two-year-old are greatly to be preferred) and setting them at least eighten inches apart in the row. The rows should be trenched eighteen inches deep and the rows not closer than four feet; see that the roots are well and evenly spread out in planting and that they are not exposed to the air longer than is absolutely necessary, as they deteriorate rapidly. For more complete detailed directions see our book on Asparagus Culture mentioned above. Every asparagus grower, large or small, should have a copy.
