NAPERVILLE NURSERIES.

OUR NURSERIES are situated adjacent to the City of Naperville, DuPage County, Illinois, some 28 miles West of Chicago, on the Chicago, Burlington & Quincy Railroad. Popular automobile routes as the "Cannon Ball," "Route No. 18" and "Starved Rock" Trails pass our nurseries over designated State Roads.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF SALE

All prices named herein are net and:

For goods f. o. b. Nurseries or cars Naperville, Illinois, exclusive of any packing, express, freight or transportation charges; packing charges are extra in addition to cost of plants. No charge for packing car lot orders in bulk.

Subject to cancellation or change without further notice upon prior sale or depletion of our stock of goods.

QUANTITY RATES WILL BE APPLIED AS FOLLOWS:

Our Lining Out Stock is packed 50 plants per bundle.

250 and up of any one item will be billed at the 1,000 rate.

50 to 250 of anyone item will be billed at the thousand rate, plus 10%.

No order accepted for less than 50 of any one item.

Orders are accepted and all shipments made subject to delays or inability to ship or deliver by reason or on account of strikes, accidents, droughts, fire, floods, frost, hail, sleet, war conditions and orders, railroad or express embargoes, priority or other transportation orders, prior sale of stock, stock shortage, labor or car shortage, or any other cause or causes for delay in shipment or delivery of goods which are beyond our control.

We never cut back tops of lining out stock unless so instructed on orders.

All shipments at purchaser's risk.

In absence of specific shipping instructions, we are to route all shipments according to our best judgment without assuming responsibility.

If destination is a Pre-Paid Station, freight charges will be prepaid by us and charged for on invoice.

Due to general conditions of weather, possible labor shortage and other contingencies, during the digging and shipping season, we do not guarantee to fill all items of an order or orders placed with us in one or first shipment.

In making all shipments we carefully consider conditions in general and act accordingly.

We reserve the right in some instances to substitute next nearest size if unable to furnish the size ordered.

We do not recommend packing lining out stock with transplanted stock either L. C. L. or C. L. Both should travel in separate packages.

When shipping carload lots out of storage, after all stock has been graded, we can ship lining out stock with transplanted stock, but even then we recommend that the lining out stock be put in boxes, so as to keep the small stock together, and also protected. Some difficulty seemingly is experienced in getting refrigerator freight service through to some Stations, and any damage to stock enroute should be promptly reported to your Transportation Company.

Claims for errors or shortage must be filed with us within Ten (10) days after receipt of goods. No claims for errors or shortage in excess of purchase price will be considered. Claims for damage to stock enroute should be immediately reported and entered with your local agent of transportation company.

Payments of accounts to be as follows:

All accounts, 30 days net cash, except

Spring accounts with Wholesale Nursery trade which are due on June 1st, of same year, Fall Accounts with Wholesale Nursery Trade which are due on December 1st of same year.

2% Discount allowed on accounts if paid within 10 days from date of shipment.

3% Discount allowed if remittance accompanies order.

The exact amount of packing charges can not be ascertained until after the goods are packed. When sending remittances with order the condition may occur that the entire amount of all the invoices for stock shipped will be less than the amount remitted, in which case the unearned portion of remittance will be refunded. All remittances and packing charges will be shown on invoice.

Payments for partial shipments shall be due on basis of Invoice dating of same.

Accounts after due dates are subject to sight draft, also interest charge at rate of 6% per annum.

Cash or satisfactory references with order, if purchaser has no credit established with us.

It is always well to have letter or information accompany any remittance to see that your remittance is properly placed to the proper account.

Certificate of inspection will be furnished with each shipment.
