This card is my only salesman this Spring; owing to sickness in my home the past summer, I have not been able to put out as large an acreage as usual, so have only the following varieties for sale this spring:

1 SENATOR DUNLAP.—This is the best variety grown in the United States. They are well-rooted plants, very hardy and good plantmakers, doing well in almost any kind of soil or locality and very productive; a very sure cropper and a good pollinizer for Warfield. The berries are good size, firm and solid; a rich, dark red, and an excellent canner holding their color, and shape after canning, in fact many canneries will take no other berry on account of its canning quality. And it is also a very good shipping berry. \$3.75 per 1,000; \$2.25 for 500; \$1.75 for 250.
