Our stock is grown in sandy land, making a fine root system.

There is no better place in Texas to buy your trees than from us, as we are well equipped to take care of your wants.

Remember, these pedigreed trees can be bought direct from us for much less money than you will pay an agent for just trees.

We advise you placing your orders early to insure getting your order filled., Frequently orders sent late in the season cannot be filled in full. Do not wait until you are ready to plant, but send your order now, with 25 per cent of the total to apply on account, and we will reserve the stock for you.

CARE OF TREES UPON ARRIVAL.

If unable to plant immediately, they should be taken from the bale and heeled out in a well drained, moist piece of ground in order that the roots may not become exposed to air and sun; water well. The ground should be well plowed, disked and harrowed before planting in orchard. Only take a few trees out at a time when planting so as to protect the roots from drying. Cut back at least one-third of the growth. Do not use unrotted stable manure in holes or around the trees. You can greatly stimulate growth by using well rotted manure, mixing well with the soil. Bone meal is a fine fertilizer for young trees; apply in March or April by digging trench around tree and apply, mixing well with soil 12 inches from trunk of tree. Give your trees a chance—it will pay.
