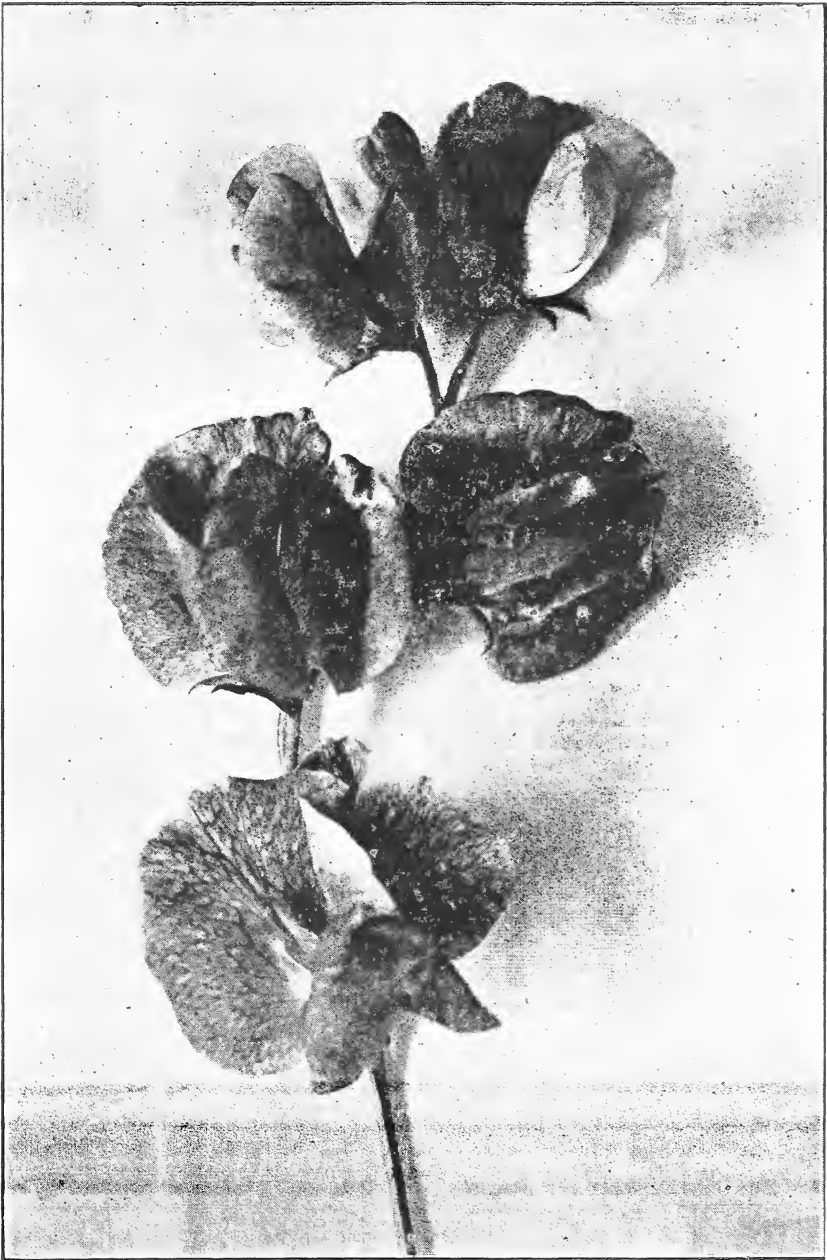

FIREBRAND

Awarded Certificate of Merit at Sweet Pea Trials of the Scottish National Sweet Pea Society at Helensburgh. This glorious Sweet Pea was developed in our garden at Park Ridge of which we are justly proud. Its color is Flaming Orange Cerise, the wings being deep Cerise, and the standards, which are often duplex, aflame with Orange Scarlet.

The plant is a vigorous grower, withstanding our torrid Illinois summers to a remarkable degree, producing its brilliant flowers in fours and sometimes fives on good long stems.

Firebrand won its spurs under the rigid tests in Scotland, and owing to its having already become well known overseas there is considerable demand for it.

If you are a keen exhibitor or a lover of these brilliant flowers for garden or home embellishment you will want Firebrand.

AMERICAN BEAUTY

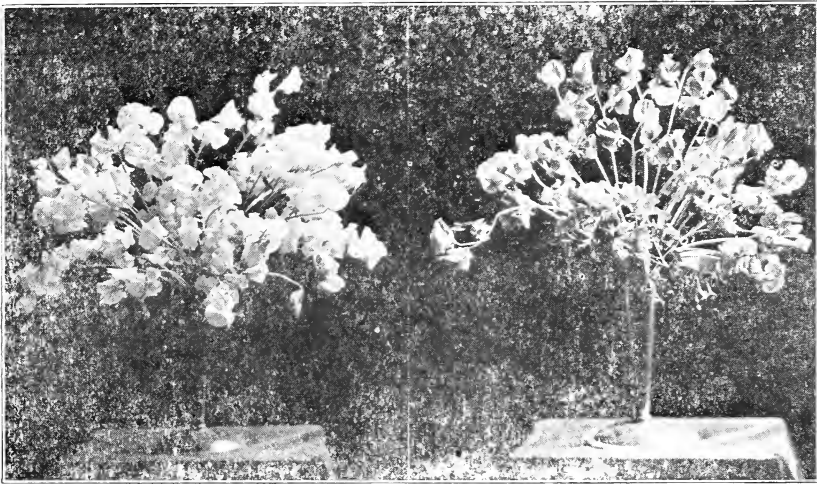

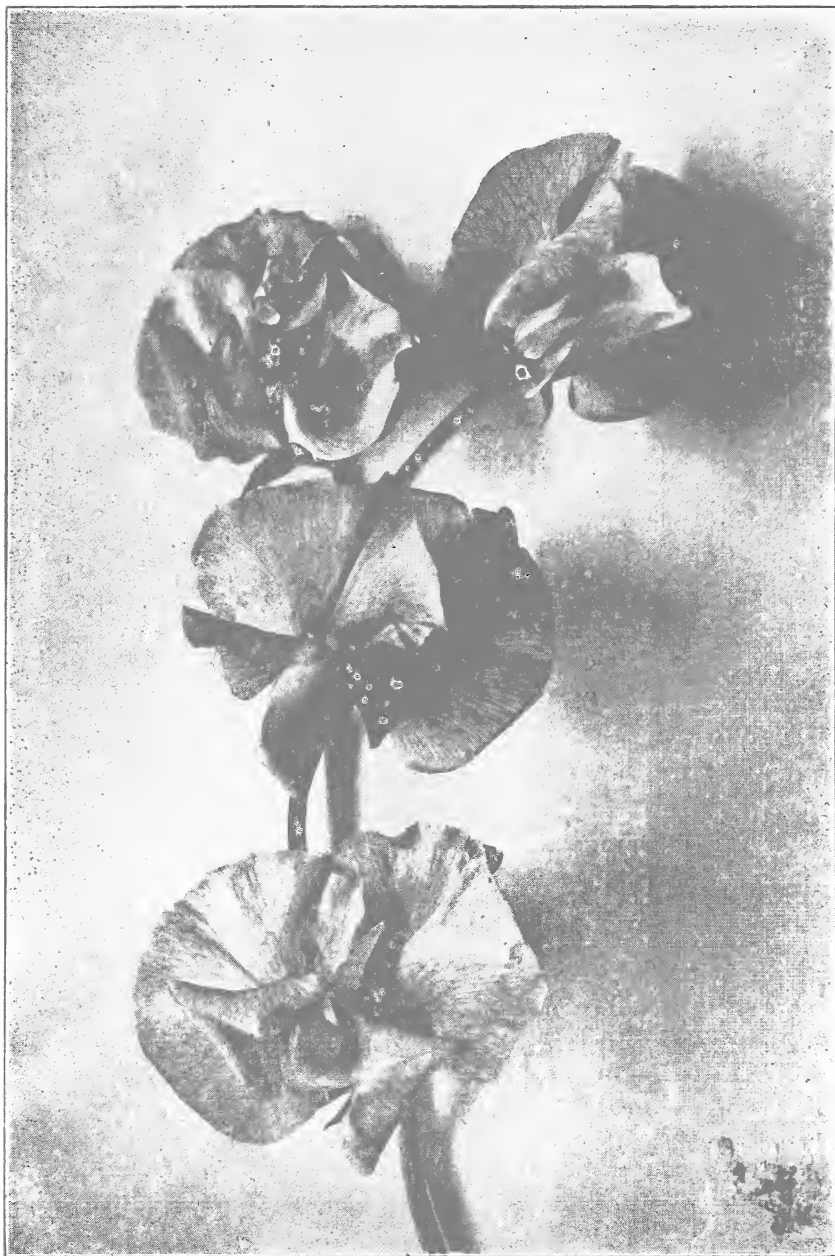

FERTILIZER

ELLIOTT'S SWEET PEA GROWER

We have grown Sweet Peas continually for over twenty years in America, during which time we have used various materials for fertilizer, and, noting the results, we recommend the mixture offered below, as we feel that it will meet the requirements of most soils and locations. It is a good substitute for animal fertilizer, now difficult to obtain. It also fills the requirements of a general garden fertilizer, being unequaled for garden Peas, Beans, Tomatoes and Sweet Corn, and flowers in general.

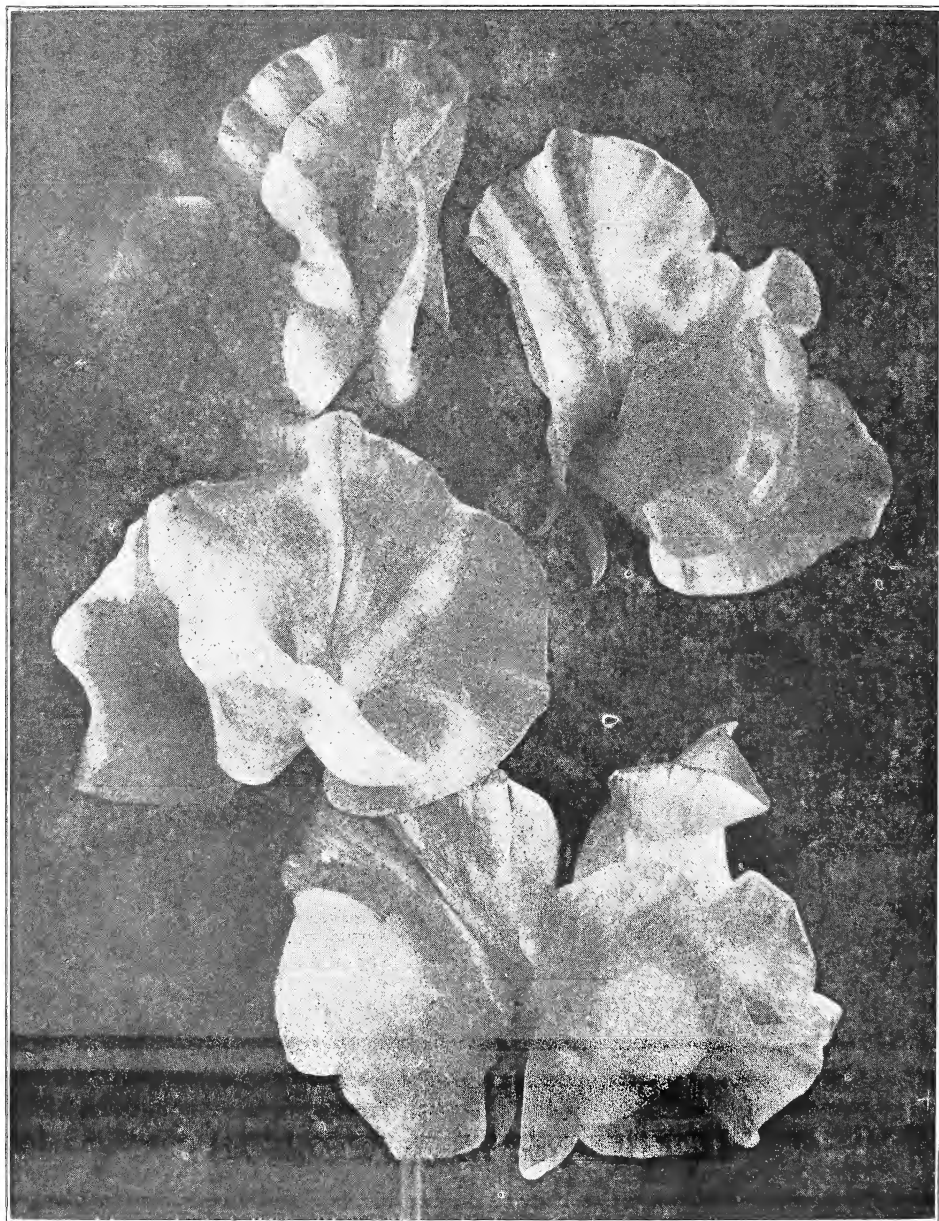
Contains $2\frac{1}{2}\%$ Nitrogen, 3% Ammonia, 12% Phosphoric Acid, 8% Potash and 2% Iron Sulphate.

When digging use four ounces per square yard; if trenching two or more spades deep, use an equal amount for the lower spit. As a top dressing for greenhouse beds or borders, use two ounces per square yard, when soil is quite moist, for potting a five inch pot full for a wheelbarrow full of soil. For use as a liquid, 1 ounce to a gallon of water.
