Roses of Recent Introduction

ALBERTINE (H. Cl.)—Vermilion buds, coppery, chamois-yellow flowers, passing to coppery rose, rather loosely formed. Somewhat fragrant. Blooms in loose clusters. Leathery shining foliage.

ALMA MATER (H. T.)—Introduced by Good & Reese Co. and named in honor of Wittenberg College. A pink rose of great beauty and form. Splendid grower, free bloomer. A sport from Columbia, lighter in color than the parent. The sea-shell pink deepening in center of bud gives a charming effect.

ANGELUS (H. T.)—Ivory white. Has the perfume, contour and most pleasing qualities of both Ophelia and Columbia which are the seed parents of this excellent rose.

ARTHUR COOK (H. T.)—Bud large, long-pointed; flower very large, extremely double, very lasting; deep velvety crimson with a beautiful sheen; long stem; strong fragrance.

ARTHUR R. GOODWIN (Per.)

—This is a genuine "Pernetiana," and is perfectly hardy everywhere. Color is coppery orange-red, passing to salmon-pink as the flowers expand.

BRIARCLIFF (H. T.)—Bud one-third longer than Columbia, very large, long-pointed flower $4\frac{1}{2}$ inches across, high center, lasting, moderate fragrance, deep rose-pink at center, passing to lighter on outer petals, with a touch of citron-green at base, borne singly on long, strong stem.

CHASTITY (H. T.)—Bud medium size, long-pointed; flower medium size, double, high center, very lasting, fragrant, pure white shading to lemon at base, borne several together, on medium-length stem. Climbing dwarf habit, blooms freely from May to July. Very hardy.

CHRISTINE PRIOR (H. T.)—Bud large, long pointed, flowers large high center and lasting, color deep, bright rosy red overlaid and flushed yellow and peach, deep yellow at base. Hardy.

CITY OF LITTLE ROCK (H. T.)—Type, Premier. Bud, medium size, long-pointed; flower medium size, semi-double, open, lasting, fragrant, hydrangea pink, borne singly on medium long stem.

DIXIE (H. T.)—Sport of Radiance, but more double. Bud large; flower large, cupped, very lasting, strong fragrance salmon-pink. Resembles Mrs. Chas. Bell, but more double, deeper salmon, more cupped.

DR. E. M. MILLS (Hy. Hugonis)—Semi-double globular, primrose with pink suffusion. Color becomes more pronounced in later blooms.

FELICITY (H. T.)—Bud long-pointed, flower large; very fragrant. Color rose-pink, silvery suffusion. Foliage dark green. Upright, strong-branching habit; very free-flowering.

F. J. GROOTENDORST (H. Rug.)—Bud small, double, borne in clusters on average length stems; very lasting; slight fragrance. Color bright red, edges of petals serrated like a carnation. Foliage sufficient, small, leathery, wrinkled, dark green; disease resistant. Vigorous grower of bushy habit, bearing a profusion of bloom from June to October. Very hardy.

FONTANELLE (H. T.)—One of the very largest of Roses with immense petals, yellow deepening color towards center. The whole bloom deepens in cool weather. Ships well in tight buds which open perfectly.

FLOREX (H. T.)—Long-pointed bud which opens an enormous flower on a strong upright stem, color a brilliant shade of coral deepening to carmine. Needs no pinching.

FRED J. HARRISON (H. T.)—Bud medium size, long-pointed; flower large, full, double, globular, lasting; cardinal-red, black blotches on edges; borne singly; very fragrant. Continuous bloomer from July to October. Hardy.

GEORGE H. MACKERETH (H. T.)—Type, Horace Vernet in color and shape of bloom only. Bud very large, long-pointed; flower very large, double, full, high-centered, lasting; velvety red, shaded dark crimson; borne singly; very fragrant. Hardy.

GLORIO (H. T.)—Color, scarlet-cerise with yellow lustre. Bud and flower large, double, lasting. Strong stem. Disease resistant. Free bloomer.

GWYNNE CARR (H. T.)—A very vigorous rose of upright growth, the blooms of which open rather flattish, but are delightfully fragrant. The color is a pale shell-pink, which has a tendency to fade as the blooms age. Very free flowering; it should prove an excellent garden variety.

HONEYMOON (H. T.)—Bud medium size, long-pointed; flower large, open, semi-double; lasting; clear chrome yellow; borne singly on medium length stems; strong fragrance. Continuous bloomer; hardy.

HUGONIS (Rosa Hugonis)—Single, yellow and fragrant. A natural species. (The golden rose of China.)

IMPERIAL POTENTATE (H. T.)—Bud large; flower large, double, high center, lasting, fragrant, dark rose-pink, slightly lighter, on reverse of petals, borne singly on long, strong stems. Continuous bloomer June to October.

JOHN C. MENSING (H. T.)—A most promising rose from Holland. Bright pink shaded golden, large petals averaging thirty to the bloom. A rose of extreme brilliancy.

Roses of Recent Introduction

JOHN RUSSELL (H. T.)—A very fine dark crimson rose with blooms of a good shape and stiff, strong petals. Mr. Easlea, who saw it growing in the raiser's nursery, tells us it is quite one of the best roses of recent years.

JOSEPHINE VESTAL (H. T.)—A Rose of attractive coloring. Color is so difficult to describe that any description can only be a partial one, and gives but a faint idea of the superb beauty and richness of the shades. It might be described as salmon-flesh, tinted rose, with a touch of yellow at the base. Its fragrance fills the room. Ranks one of the best of the garden Roses. Hardy in almost all localities.

JUNE BOYD (H. T.)—Long-pointed bud, flower large, double high centered very lasting. Salmon carmine yellow at base, opens to bright peach-blossom pink, continuous bloomer.

JUSTINA (H. T.)—Has a very large long-pointed bud, petals recurving on the opening flowers, color a beautiful salmon-pink, tinted apricot and gold, delightfully fragrant. A very strong vigorous grower. It might well be described as a glorified Madame Butterfly but more highly colored.

LADY DIXON HARTLAND (H. T.)—Bud long-pointed; flower opens well, high center, fragrant, deepest salmon at center shading to pale pink on outer petals. Abundant, continuous bloomer.

LA CHAMPAGNE (H. T.)—A meritorious and distinct variety of strong, robust habit, with large, long buds of beautiful shape, which develop into good full bloom; color bright chamois, shading to yellow with apricot at center and peach-blossom reflex and yellow base.

LORD CHARLEMONT (H. T.)—Bud very long-pointed; flower large, full, high centered, perfectly shaped; clear crimson, deepening to carmine-crimson; strong fragrance.

LOS ANGELES (H. T.)—Lovely buds and exquisite flowers of salmon pink with yellow shading, very sweetly perfumed. In favored locations it does well.

LUCIE NICHOLAS MEYER (H. T.)—Bud large, flower large, double, globular, very lasting; dark pink, lighter at the edges; borne, singly and severally, on strong stem; moderate fragrance. Foliage glossy green. Disease resistant. Blooms continuously.

LUCY FERDINAND DAVID (H. T.)—Long-pointed bud, flower large, full cupped, very fragrant. Pure white with slightly cream center, borne on strong stem.

LUCINDA (H. T.)—A lovely sport from Columbia. Bright even color a bright rose. Bud opens into a well rounded flower of graceful form.

MADAME ALEXANDRE DREUX (Per.)—Color, deep, orange, very brilliant, and with Bud, long, slender and pointed, opening into a flower of beautiful form, held upright on a long stiff stem, good foliage beautifully arranged, bloom medium size.

MABEL TURNER (H. T.)—A fairly vigorous rose, with well-shaped faintly scented blooms, carried on long, stiff stems. The color is a bright pink, shaded white, reminding one of the old rose "La France." Foliage olive-green and fairly free of mildew. It should be useful as a bedding variety.

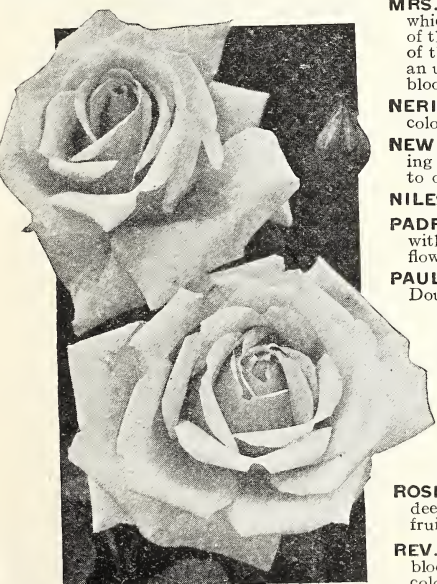
MISS LOLITA ARMOUR (H. T.)—Burnished buds and creamy copper flowers, with reddish tinge.

MME. MERCIER MOLIN (H. T.)—Bud long-pointed; flowers large, full; fiery red tinted with crimson, edges of petals slightly tinted with rosy-pink; borne on long, strong stem, sweet-fragrance. Vigorous very free bloomer.

MRS. F. R. PIERSON (H. T.)—Sport from Premier, scarlet crimson, color perfect.

Bud, long, slender and pointed, opening into a flower of beautiful form, held upright on a long stiff stem, good foliage beautifully arranged, bloom medium size.

MRS. WARREN E. LENON (H. T.)—Bud large, long pointed; flower large, semi-double, globular, lasting, very fragrant, carmine-crimson, borne singly on medium-long stem. Continuous bloomer.

MRS. C. W. EDWARDS (H. T.)—Bud large, long-pointed; flower very large, double, high centered; pure crimson-carmine, yellow base, on the outside of the petals the yellow bases run into veinings of yellow; moderate fragrance. Profuse and continuous bloomer. Hardy.

MARCIA STANHOPE (H. T.)—Bud large, globular, streaked slightly with carmine; bloom large, double, globular very lasting; pure white, strong fragrance. Foliage disease-resistant. Profuse bloomer. Hardy.

MATCHLESS (H. T.)—Bud very large, long-pointed, deep cerise-pink; flower immense, full, very double, intensely strong fragrance, lasting well, uniform cerise-pink, borne singly on long strong stem. Growth very vigorous.

MRS. WILLIAM C. EGAN (Per.)—Strong healthy grower, with long, pointed buds which develop into flowers of good shape. In color, it is a two-tone pink, the reverse of the petals a soft light pink, the interior deep flesh color with a golden line at the base of the petals; the flowers are carried on long stiff stems, and last in good condition for an unusually long time, either cut or on the plant; an exceptionally free and continuous bloomer.

NERISSA (H. T.)—Pink buds, opening into creamy double flowers, deepening to peach color in center. Mild fragrance.

NEW COLUMBIA (H. T.)—Sport of Columbia. Flower true pink, deepening to glowing pink—a little lighter than Columbia, with outer petals reflexed, allowing the bud to open better. All other characteristics like Columbia.

NILES COCHET (The True Red Cochet.)—Red changing to deep rose.

PADRE (H. T.)—Coppery-scarlet with bright yellow at base of petals. Semi-double with 15 to 20 petals, often curiously notched, strong erect grower exceptionally free flowering.

PAULS LEMON PILLAR (Cl. H. T.)—Pale lemon buds and faint sulphur yellow flowers. Double well formed and fragrant, strong grower.

PREMIER (H. T.)—Rich dark pink flowers of full size, fine form, and pleasing fragrance, borne singly on stiff, thornless stems arising from a vigorous and robust plant.

RAPTURE (H. T.)—A "fancy color" rose that has Ophelia for its parentage. Bright apricot coral suffused rose and gold. Intensely brilliant. Has more petals than its parent and produces more bloom than Butterfly.

RED PREMIER (H. T.)—Sport of Premier. Bud large, pointed; flower large to medium, double, full, high-centered; bright carmine; borne singly on strong stems of medium length; very fragrant. Foliage abundant, large leathery rich green; disease-resistant.

ROSELANDIA (H. T.)—Sport of Golden Ophelia. Flower larger than parent and deeper in color with high-pointed center, every bloom coming perfect, borne singly; fruity fragrance; free.

REV. F. PAGE ROBERTS (H. T.)—A fine rose of a vigorous habit, with good shaped blooms, which are carried erect on long stiff stems, and are very sweetly scented. The color is an orange-yellow, becoming lighter at the edges of the petals. It is an excellent exhibition and garden rose.

Roses of Recent Introduction

RHEIMS (Per.)—Bud long-pointed; flower very large, flesh pink, shaded apricot and coppery-orange; petals sometimes imbricated.

RICHARD E. WEST (H. T.)—Bud large, long-pointed; flower large, double, full, lasting; clear yellow self; very fragrant. Foliage disease resistant. Very vigorous, upright, bushy; free and continuous bloomer. Hardy.

ROYAL RED (H. T.)—A vigorous grower large foliage and good bloom of intense glowing crimson. The buds are large, well formed and the fragrance is delightful.

SARAH VAN FLEET (Hy. R.)—Wild rose pink, semi-double, open cupped flower, intensely fragrant. True Rugosa foliage resistant to disease.

SHOT SILK (Per.)—Bud, medium size, ovoid; flower medium size, double, full, high-centered, lasting; cherry-cerise, shot with golden yellow; very fragrant. Foliage disease-resistant. Vigorous, upright, bushy; profuse and continuous bloomer. Hardy.

SENSATION—As large and more prolific than Premier. Well supplied with a heavy luxuriant foliage. The flowers are fine any season of the year. The color is an entrancing shade of red. The bud long-pointed and the open flower beautiful, with extreme size and good color to the last. Properly grown, it will produce more dollars per square foot of space than any other rose of today.

SENATOR (H. T.)—Bud, very large, long-pointed; flower very large, high-centered, very double, strongly fragrant, long lasting brilliant scarlet; borne singly on medium length, strong stems. Growth, very vigorous, bushy, blooms abundantly and continuously.

SOUV. DE CLAUDIUS PERNET (Per.)—The sensation of the day in yellow Roses. Sunflower yellow large blooms, perfectly formed. Very fragrant, dark glossy foliage. Vigorous growth.

TEMPLAR (H. T.)—Bud medium size, globular; flower medium size, double globular, very lasting. Vigorous, upright, abundant and continuous bloomer. A new forcing Rose which is making its way into the garden. Clear bright red, of exceeding double form and with fine strong stems. Few thorns. Perfumed.

THERESE ZEIMET LAMBERT (H. T.)—Type, Killarney. Bud large, long-pointed; flower large, full, double, high-centered; deep rose, with yellow ground, orange base; borne singly, on long stem; strong fragrance. Foliage, bronze green, disease resistant. Few thorns. Vigorous, upright; intermittent bloomer, hardy.

UNA WALLACE (H. T.)—The blooms, which are well formed, and sweetly scented are carried on long stiff stems. The color is a beautiful soft, even toned cherry-rose without shading. In depth, formation and substance it is faultless. It is one of the freest growers and remarkably free-flowering.

WHITE ENSIGN (H. T.)—Bud pointed medium size, very double high center. White sometimes showing creamy white. Flowers singly and several together on long stem.

WINSOME (H. T.)—Flower large, very double, full, high center, very lasting, slight fragrance, cherry-rose, borne singly on medium long stem. Foliage sufficient, rich green. Few thorns, Vigorous; abundant, continuous bloomer.

W. FREELAND KENDRICK (Originally called Bloomfield Endurance) (H. T.)—Bud medium size, ovoid, flesh-white; flower large, slightly globular, very double, full, very lasting, fragrant, flesh deepening to peach in center, borne singly and several together on medium length, strong stem. Very disease resistant. Very vigorous, semi-climber (5 ft. in Pa.) one profuse continuous bloomer (189 blooms in Portland) from May to November. Very hardy.

WILHELM KORDES (Per.)—Bud large, long-pointed; flower large, double, full, high-centered, very lasting; golden yellow, with coppery yellow at edges and on petals exposed to the sun; borne singly on long strong stems; strong fragrance.

AMERICAN LEGION (H. T.)—Bud; well shaped, globular; flower large, full, lasting, cerise-red, throughout, fragrant.

ANNIE LAURIE (H. T.)—Sport of Ophelia. Bud large, long pointed; flower large, cupped, very double (forty petals), very lasting; flesh pink; edges deeper, golden yellow base. Borne on long stem; disease resistant. Few thorns. Very vigorous, upright, bushy. Profuse and continuous bloomer.

ANTOINE RIVOIRE (H. T.)—Called by the trade Mrs. Taft. Rosy-flesh on yellow ground.

BESSIE BROWN—Creamy-white flowers; sweetly scented.

CHAMPION OF THE WORLD (Woodhouse Bourbon 1894.)—Clear bright pink always in bloom. Much larger flowers than Hermosa.

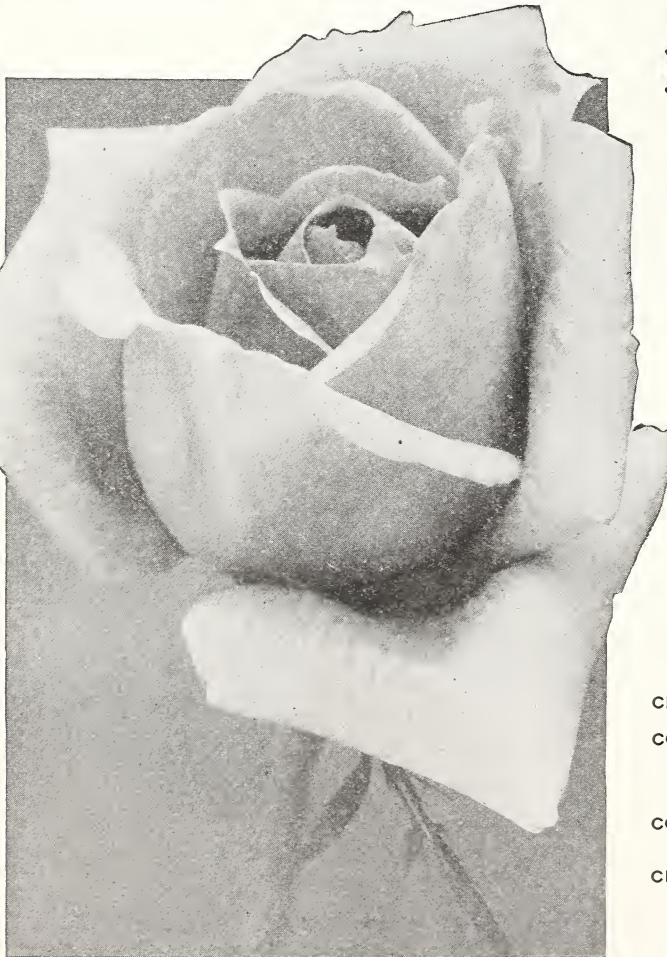
CHARLES K. DOUGLAS (H. T.)—Bud large, long pointed; flower large, full, double, sweet fragrance; color, intense flaming scarlet, flushed bright velvety crimson. Foliage dark green; disease resistant; vigorous, upright grower, produces an abundance of blooms from June to October.

CHARMER (H. T.)—Silvery pink, with long pointed buds, good strong stems.

COL. OSWALD FITZGERALD (H. T.)—A brilliant Rose. Its blood red velvety-crimson beautifully finished blooms are produced in great profusion on erect stems; branching; pure tea perfume.

COLONEL R. S. WILLIAMSON (H. T.)—Color satiny-white with deep blush center; blooms large.

CRUSADER (H. T.)—A big, strong growing variety, robust and rugged in every characteristic; the growth is heavy and the flower stems strong and heavy. It is free flowering and the blooms are big and double, and in color a rich velvety crimson. A free flowering red Rose that is a wonder.

Hybrid Tea Roses

COLUMBIA (H. T.)—It is a big Rose. The color is a true pink, about the shade of a perfect Sawyer, deepening as it opens to glowing pink.

COMMONWEALTH (H. T.)—Bud large, long, pointed; flower large, open, double, very lasting; deep pink, solid color, borne singly on medium strong stem; moderate fragrance. Foliage sufficient, leathery, medium size, rich, green, disease resistant. Few thorns. Vigorous, upright; continuous bloomer. Fine for Summer forcing.

CRIMSON QUEEN (H. T.)—Strong, upright grower, flowers large and full. Color a rich, bright velvety crimson. A grand garden Rose, always in bloom.

DUCHESS OF WELLINGTON (H. T.)—Intense saffron-yellow, stained with rich crimson.

EDEL (H. T.)—Bud very large; flower very large, double, well built, stately; opens well in all weather; sweet fragrance. Color, white, with the faintest ivory shading toward base, passing to pure white. Foliage bold and distinct. Very vigorous grower; free bloomer.

ETOILE DE FRANCE (H. T.)—Color a lovely shade of clear, red-crimson velvet; very fragrant.

ELSIE BECKWITH (H. T.)—Vigorous, upright habit of growth. The very sweetly scented blooms, with large bold stiff petals, are produced on strong stems. Not liable to damage by rain. Color a rich glowing rosy pink.

ETOILE DE HOLLAND (H. T.)—Flower bright red, of medium size, fairly full; deliciously perfumed. Growth vigorous, upright. A rose of great future.

ETINCELANTE (C.)—Bright brilliant red, large, full and of fine form, opening into an enormous bouquet of fragrance.

EUGENE E. MARLITT (H. T.)—It is a grand Rose, none better; being exceptionally healthy, vigorous and freeblooming. The flowers are large, very double, of a rich bright carmine, with scarlet tones which do not fade in the hottest weather. It is quite hardy and fragrant.

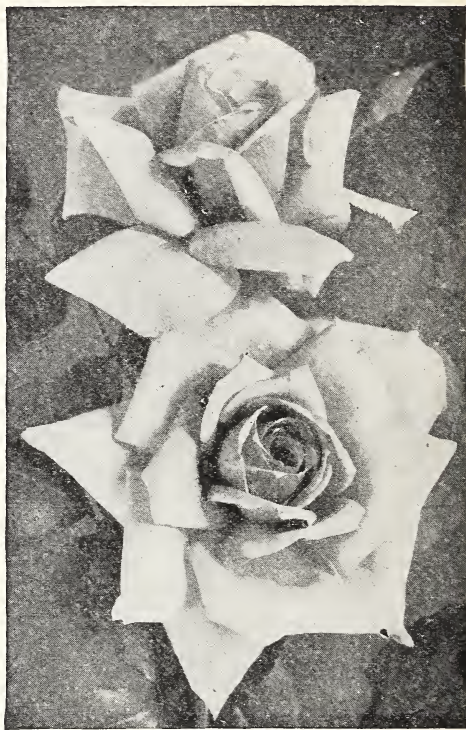

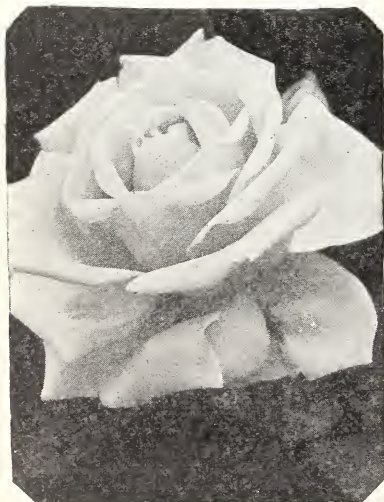

CLIMBING AMERICAN BEAUTY (H. W.)—Same color, size and fragrance as American Beauty, with the addition of the climbing habit. Good foliage and better blooming qualities. One plant of this new Rose will produce twenty times as many flowers in June as the old American Beauty.

CLIMBING WHITE AMERICAN BEAUTY (H. W.)—A hardy disease-resistant variety; vigorous growth and great freedom of bloom. It is much more double than Silver Moon, with but one flower to a stem. Has excellent keeping qualities.

CRIMSON RAMBLER (C. P.)—Bright crimson flowers produced in large clusters of pyramidal form; grand variety for pillars and arches and to train over porches; also makes a fine attractive hedge.

DOROTHY PERKINS (H. W.)—A most beautiful deep pink; the flowers are borne in large clusters of small double blooms and are very sweetly scented; quite first class.

DR. HUEY (H. W.)—Bud medium size; semi-double; borne in clusters of 3 or 4 on good stems; lasting. Color, dark crimson-maroon, of great brilliancy; stamens and anthers light yellow. Blooms continuously for three weeks.

DR. W. VAN FLEET (H. W.)—Flowers when open run four inches and over in diameter. The center is built high, petals beautifully undulated and cupped. The color is a remarkable delicate shade of flesh-pink on the outer surface, deepening to rosy-flesh in the center.

EMILY GRAY (H. W.)—A new yellow climbing Rose with glossy, undulated holly-like foliage. The buds are long and flowers of golden yellow are large and semi-double. A valuable acquisition. Needs winter protection north of Washington, D. C.

EUGENE JACQUET—The earliest and most profuse flowering of all the climbers and of the easiest cultivation. Almost every eye produces a handsome truss of fragrant, cherry-red flowers Eugene Jacquet can be bloomed in February without difficulty. It flowers a week earlier than Tausendschoen or Rosarie under the same conditions and carries handsome, dark green, mildew resisting foliage. It holds the flower unusually long—the color improves with age. Eugene Jacquet should be forced so as to show color ten days before Easter to be at its best for Easter sales.

GARDENIA (H. W.)—Bright yellow, cream color when open; very fragrant and free; early flowering. This is the hardy Marechal Niel; double yellow flowering.

HEART OF GOLD (H. W.)—Bud medium size; flower medium size, single, open, lasting, crimson shading to white center with yellow stamens, borne in clusters on medium long stems. Very hardy.

HIAWATHA (H. W.)—Its flowers are about one and one-half inches across, and produced in long, pendulous sprays, with frequently from forty to fifty flowers on a spray. In color, it is brilliant ruby-carmine, with a clear white eye and a mass of golden stamens.

JACOTTE (H. W.)—Bud large, orange and yellow; flower large, semi-double, open, cupped, very lasting; deep coppery yellow tinted coppery red; borne, several together, on long, strong stem; fragrant. Blooms profusely in May and June.

JEAN GIRIN (The ever-blooming Dorothy Perkins.)—The flowers are similar in form and color to the pink Dorothy Perkins. The chief merit of this rose is that after giving a mass of bloom in June, unlike the other climbers, it blooms again.... Cut off all of the old June blooms to help the plant produce more flowers during the summer and fall.

LADY GAY (W.)—Flowers of a deep cherry-pink, shading on the edge of the petals to a very delicate soft tone of pink.

MARY LOVETT (H. W.)—In this Dr. Van Fleet has brought out another Wichuraiana Hybrid a "White Dr. Van Fleet." This rose has done well and is strongly recommended. Loses foliage early.

PAUL'S SCARLET CLIMBER (H. W.)—Vivid scarlet, shaded crimson, makes a brilliant display for a long period of time in the garden. A wonderful climbing Rose. We consider it the most wonderful hardy Climbing Rose.

Mary Wallace

A Great Breeder's Legacy.

Rugosas

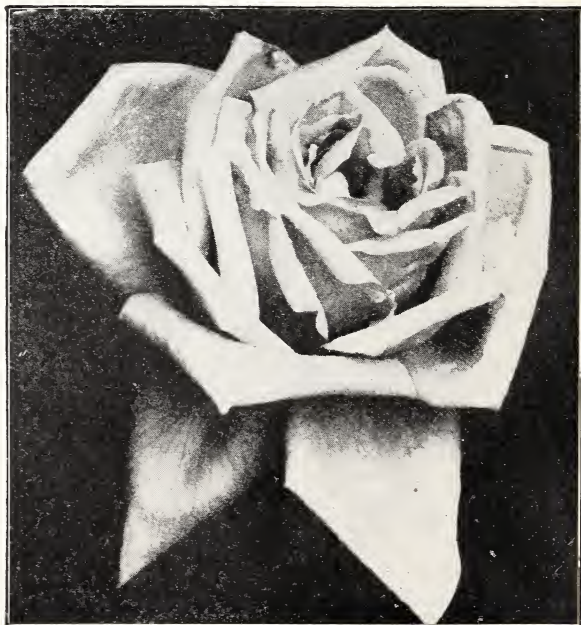
