AMERICAN ARBORVITAE—The habit is erect and pyramidal, foliage soft and light green in color. They grow quickly, and if untrimmed, grow large.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Terms Cash; Trees will be dug, properly packed, balled and burlapped, where necessary, at prices given. Deliveries free in Newport News, by truck. Orders amounting to ten dollars or more delivered free by truck to Williamsburg, Yorktown, Hampton, Phoebus and Old Point.

Stock for shipment will be properly packed and delivered to Chesapeake & Ohio Railway Co. at Oyster Point, Va., taking the agents receipt therefor which will be mailed to customer, and claims for damages must be made to the Railroad or Express companies.

Be sure to give instructions as to how to ship, and especially if freight and post office are different.

We deliver only healthy vigorous stock, but the conditions over which we have no control are such (viz., planting weather, soil conditions, etc.) we do not guarantee the life of our stock, except at an advanced rate.

Orders received subject to stock being unsold at time order is received. We do not substitute unless requested. Money will be returned at once received for stock we cannot furnish.
