NOTICE

In order to get good seeds and true to name, you will do well to purchase of those who have had experience in the business, and know the different species and when they are ripe enough to gather, and who superintend the collection of their stock in person. Some of the coniferae are so much alike in appearance that none but an experienced eye can distinguish them apart.

IMPORTANT

It is very important that customers send in their orders as early as possible. Some varieties have to be gathered in June; from that time until October, the different species are ripening. Certain coniferae seed can be gathered as late as the last of December, but if the weather is bad, it is very expensive, therefore we have to advance the prices after the 1st of October, but we will keep the prices down as long as we can make a fair profit.

Please state mode of carriage. Our prices are for goods F. O. B. Roy, Washington. Purchasers have to pay transportation charges.

We will fill orders in rotation, as long as crop holds out and seeds can be collected.
