Instead of catalogs, you will receive frequent and periodical bulletins concerning new crops, and new prices made possible by our new "low overhead" location.

In short, the use of bulletins, instead of catalogs, permits more timely circulation of our offers, and prevents disappointment arising from sold items which remain listed in catalogs long after stocks are sold out.

TERMS. Cash with order, excepting to previous customers who have established credit and who order in excess of \$10. Orders for less than \$10 must be accompanied by cash in all cases.

GUARANTEE. Plants are guaranteed true to name and to arrive in satisfactory condition. Their subsequent success, however, depends upon culture, soil, insects, and climate beyond our control. Reports of damaged or imperfect plants must be made within 24 hours after shipment is received. Adjustment will be equally prompt.

PRICES are F. O. B. our station, and do not include transportation or delivery. Express is preferable to parcel-post shipment. Parcel-post shipment will be made at cost, plus 8 cents to cover extra detail and service involved. In case of local deliveries the minimum delivery charge is \$1 per order.

The packing and boxing of bulky material, which requires a proportionately larger amount of labor and materials, will be charged for at cost. Purchaser will be informed as to amount of charge before shipment is made.

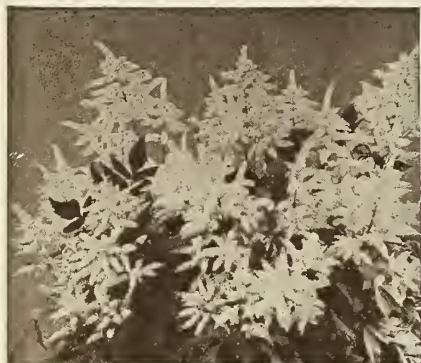

Give them good garden soil, ordinary weather conditions, and they will grow and increase in numbers from year to year.

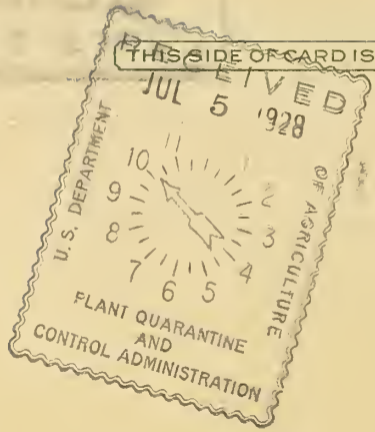

HOW TO GROW PEONIES

When to Plant. Peonies may be planted in early spring before the sprouts appear, or in fall, from the middle of August until the ground freezes. Fall is, in general, the better time, because bloom usually will follow the next spring, while spring-planted roots usually will not bloom until a year later.

Where to Plant. Given average garden soil, abundant sunshine, and good drainage, Peonies may be planted in any location and for any purpose. Shady, wet, and over-fertilized locations are not favorable.

How to Plant. Dig holes or furrows to a depth and diameter of about 15 inches. Fill in the bottom with enough loose ground, so that the eyes of the Peony will be 2 inches below the surface after the hole is filled in and mounded for drainage, the roots, of course, projecting downward and the eyes upward. Pack the ground firmly while planting. Plant from 3 to 4 feet apart. Do not use manure. Vigoro is an ideal fertilizer.

After Planting. Water during dry spells and cover with leaves or straw after the ground is frozen in winter. In spring most of this top-dressing should be worked into the soil, and cultivation

should be frequent and regular. After the blooming season, three or four cultivations will be sufficient until the following spring. Vigoro, sprinkled around the plants before rains or waterings, is a safe and most convenient fertilizer during the blooming season and in late August when new root-growth is forming. When cutting Peonies, allow at least two leaves to remain on each stem—the roots will need these "lungs" when they make their fall growth. Do not remove the foliage in fall before November, or at least not until it is thoroughly dead.

Merit of Varieties. More than 500 varieties of Peonies, once included in the Farr collection, are not in this list because they have been discarded. There are no poor Peonies, but it can be realized that, after such discarding, every Peony offered in this issue of Better Plants is a "best" variety.

Size of Divisions. Prices as specified apply to standard divisions bearing from 2 to 5 eyes, the size which, under normal conditions, will bloom next spring.

Abbreviations: E, early; M, midseason; EM, early midseason; LM, late midseason; L, late. 7.7, 9.7, etc., indicate grade of merit awarded by American Peony Society.

TREE PEONIES

BANKSI. Large; semi-double; pale lilac-rose. Free bloomer. Divisions from 8-year plants, 2 to 4 feet high, at \$6 each; 5 or more at \$5 each. Entire plants 8 to 10 years old, containing from 5 to 6 divisions, for \$18 each. All shipments by express.

CULTURE.—Once established, Tree Peonies are almost as hardy as lilacs. For the first winter they should be mulched heavily. South and east exposures are the best locations and none except mature, established plants should be exposed to the north and west winter winds. Feed with bone-meal. Keep watered and cultivated. Plant deeply. Double varieties frequently bloom single and semi-double until thoroughly established. Tips of branches die back during winter, but plants gradually grow into bushes from 3 to 5 feet in height and spread, bearing, in many cases, more than a hundred blooms. Tree Peonies bloom from two to three weeks earlier than herbaceous varieties, with larger and more beautiful blooms, the petals of which, in most cases, resemble crêpe paper, and the colors are clear and intense.

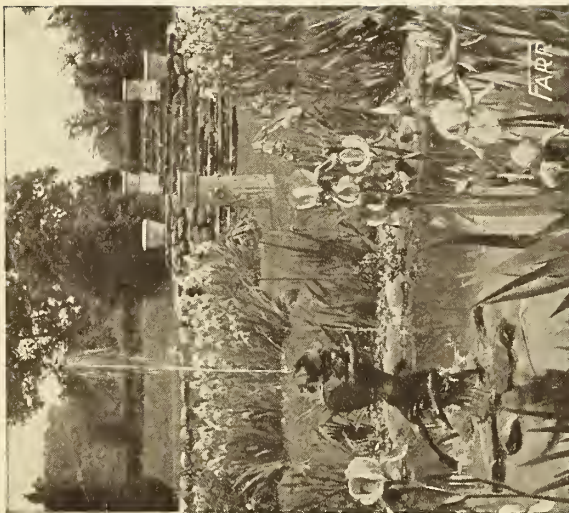
