This list cancels all previous quotations. All agreements and contracts are made subject to crop losses through unavoidable causes.

**THE PRICES** named in this list are based upon present market conditions, and are subject to change without notice. We invite correspondence with prospective buyers, and shall be pleased to quote special prices on want lists calling for larger quantities than are named herein. On the other hand, these are **wholesale prices** and are applicable only to **wholesale quantities**; in no case will we fill retail orders, even though from nurserymen. All orders should be made up in 10's or multiples of 10. As only hundred rates are quoted in this list, prices on assortments of 10 of an item will be figured at **20 per cent. additional**.

**TERMS.** The usual terms are offered to those of established credit or whose responsibility is known to us. Cash, security, or satisfactory references required from unknown parties. All bills are due in sixty days unless other arrangements are made at the time of sale. **All prices are net and not subject to any discount unless specially agreed upon.**

**SHIPPING.** Customers are requested to give definite instructions in regard to manner of shipping that they desire. In the absence of special instructions we will use our own best judgment, but with the express understanding that it is without responsibility on our part. All shipments travel at the risk and cost of the purchaser. We have the New York Central, the West Shore, the Pennsylvania Railroads, also the Rochester and Syracuse interurban trolley line, enabling us to ship in any direction over trunk lines. Express is handled over three of these routes.

**BOXES** will be charged for at the rated noted below. These are somewhat reduced on account of our being able to buy lumber somewhat more reasonably. These rates, however, do not really cover present actual cost to us.

**D**ELICATE and charming in the mist-like profusion of its snow-white flowers, it is not only effective as a garden subject, but its cut sprays are also particularly useful for blending with other garden flowers. Commencing to flower fully ten days before the older double kind—late June here—the small side sprays combine daintily with sweet peas, then at their best, and the larger sprays add charm to any combination of cut-flowers.

Its value as a cut-flower is further enhanced because the sprays, if allowed to dry, retain their grace and clean color, and can be used effectively with everlasting flowers.

Briefly described, Bristol Fairy has all the virtues of the well-known Double Baby's Breath (*Gypsophila paniculata flore-pleno*) but it is superior in these respects: Its flowers are almost three times larger, are pure-white under all conditions, and being more widely spaced, are better poised and more graceful in every way. Its growth is more vigorous and sturdy, attaining a height of 4 feet, with a spread fully as broad.

Best of all, after the first flowers are cut, it flowers periodically until severe frost, so that cut sprays are always available and the plant is attractive throughout the season.

**I**T IS only once in a lifetime that a really worth-while, outstanding novelty in hardy shrubs is introduced, and in this new Barberry we have such a plant.
