Cultural directions will be found in our descriptive catalog and if you do not have a copy, we will be glad to supply you with one upon request. Briefly, any good garden soil will be found sufficient to raise good peonies. Keep the soil loose about the plant and occasional watering will be found beneficial. When planting see that the eyes are placed at least two inches below the surface of the ground. Shallow planting will be even better than too deep planting which often results in failure to bloom. Care after blooming period will insure a good crop of flowers the following spring.

Give us an opportunity to serve you and we will assure satisfaction. Most of the plants we send out will be undivided plants grown one year from division.

Remittances must accompany orders unless satisfactory credit has been previously established. Post office money order, check or bank draft made payable to Sunny Acres Nursery is preferred. Stamps will be accepted for small amounts.

Discounts: On orders up to \$10.00, a discount of 5% will be allowed; on orders from \$10.00 to \$30.00, a discount of 8% and on orders from \$30.00 up, a discount of 10% may be deducted from the prices herein quoted. This applies only when cash accompanies the order.

## IRIS

Along with the early spring blooming perennials we find the Iris among the leaders. For a wide range in coloring, delicate combinations of color, airy bloom, combined with unusual hardiness, we find the Iris in the front rank. They multiply so rapidly under normal conditions that it is possible to have a large collection in a few years from a very modest beginning. If you are not now enjoying their beauty, try a liberal planting this season. Some of the improved varieties are marvelously beautiful.

We are showing the rating in the column preceding the name of the variety that will be of assistance in arriving at comparative values as to desirability. We are carrying some that are not rated high but which we feel possess more merit than the rating indicates.

## Sunny Acres Nursery, Robbinsdale, Minn.

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In planting Iris, the rhizome, or enlarged root, should be placed very near the surface of the ground. The soil should be firmly placed about the roots to hold the plant in place. Good drainage, frequent cultivation, fertile but not too enriched soil will produce the best Iris for you.
