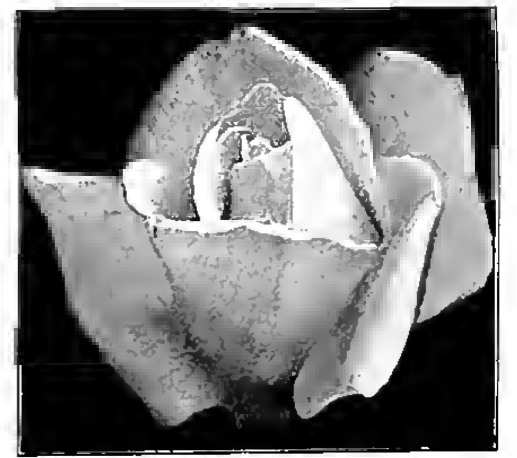
Talisman The Sensational 1929 Introduction

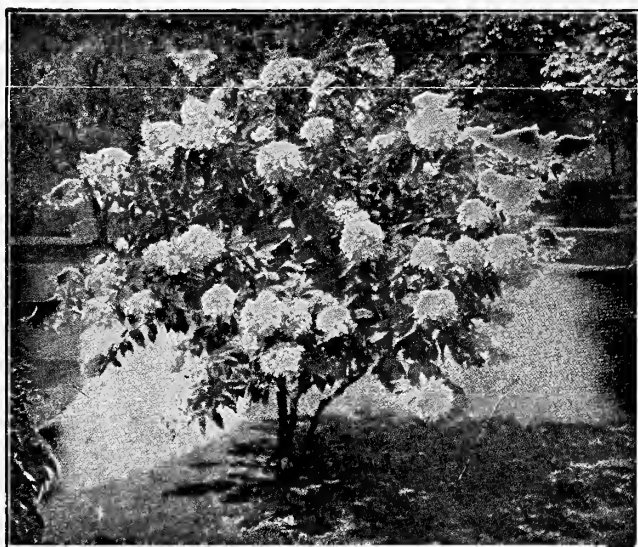
