

NEW ANNUAL ANCHUSA "Blue Bird"

This sterling novelty grows about 18 inches high, is of compact habit, and bears its flowers in a luxuriant bouquet at the top of the plant. The flowers are of a vivid indigo blue and of brilliant effect in any scheme for the decoration of beds and borders. **Pkt. 50c.**

NEW ANTIRRHINUM Ceylon Court Yellow



ANNUALS

These play a big part in the great color schemes of brilliant beds and borders in our Summer gardens. Both for garden effect and for cutting their beauty and usefulness is equally valuable, and by careful choice as to height, color and time of blooming, effective arrangements can be made for a continuous display away into the Fall. Annuals are also effectively used in the hardy plant borders, particularly in filling in those empty spaces after Tulips, Narcissi, and other early Spring bulbs have bloomed, the seed being sown right over the bulbs.

HARDY ANNUALS. Sow in the open ground where they are intended to bloom. The seeds should be sown thinly and covered with fine soil to a greater or less depth, according to the size of the seed.

HALF-HARDY ANNUALS. The seeds should be sown
