Peonies

This year, again, we are listing Peonies. We have selected the best varieties for either cutting or commercial purposes. All divisions will have from three to five eyes from two year clumps, free from disease and guaranteed true to name.

Albatre —A magnificent flower which opens like a rose. Pure white with a few pencilings of carmine on the edge of center petals. Fragrant; crown type; late midseason. An old variety, but one that will stand comparison with anything there is.....	\$0.40
Augustine d'hour —Bomb type; midseason. Extremely large; showy, perfectly built bloom. Color very deep, rich brilliant solferino-red with slight silvery reflex. It is a taller grower and larger flower than Felix Crousse.....	.40
Baroness Schroeder —Rose type; late. White with shadings of flesh. This is one of the finest Peonies. Its immense flowers of great substance with high chalice-shaped center are freely produced, lasting a long time. Very fragrant.....	.70
Charles McKellip —Crown type; midseason. Open rose-shaped and develops into crown type. The irregular rich crimson petals of the center are mingled with gold stamens and surrounded by rows of broad silky guard petals. It has a charm peculiarly its own.....	.80
Chestine Gowdy —Crown type; late midseason. The broad outer petals are silvery pink. These enclose a zone of fine irregularly shaped petals of deep rich cream, which in turn surround a prominent cone of broad pink petals splashed and tipped with crimson. One of the best varieties for cut flowers.....	.80
Duchess de Nemours —Early. A lovely pure white variety, with sulphur-white collar; medium size; fragrant.....	.35
Eugene Verdier —Large flat semi-rose type flower. Pale hydrangea pink, collar lighter, center deeper flecked crimson. Tall, erect, free bloomer with fine fragrance. Very distinct appearance.....	.40
Felix Crousse —Medium, bright red, very large and fragrant. One of the finest reds. Midseason.....	.50
Festiva Maxima —Early, pure white with crimson markings in the center. Rose type. Very large. Fragrant. Midseason.....	.30
Germaine Bigot —A most excellent pink. Very large and a royal variety. Midseason50
Jeanne D'Arc —Crown type; midseason. Soft pink intermingled with sulphur-white and rose. Center spotted carmine.....	.50
Jubilée —Rose type; midseason. Buds show delicate opal tints; as they unfold the color changes to ivory-white. Unlike other Peony buds which are round, these are pointed like a rose.....	1.00
Karl Rosenfield —A better Peony and a better quality of red than any of the older red sorts; pure, rich, intense crimson. Of Half-rose type, it makes and remains a splendid full, rounded flower of excellent substance, equally valuable as cut flowers or garden grower75
Kelway's Queen —The true variety is one of the most beautiful peonies. Its large, globular, rose type blooms, similar in form to Solange, have the center high-built and cupped. In color it is a uniform mauve-rose, with the broad center petals tipped carmine, and a tinting of carmine-pink deep down in the petals that livens up the bloom wonderfully. Fragrant.....	6.00
La Fee —Crown type; Very large globular flowers, with a silvery and creamy yellow collar. Fragrant	6.00

La Perle—Blush white center. Rose type. Large cup shaped flowers, blush white, growing a little darker around the edges. A fine cut flower variety and a perfect landscape plant.....	.75
L'Indispensable—Very full, globular flowers of lilac-white, shading to pale violet-rose toward center.....	.40
Livingston—Perfect rose type. Pale lilac-rose, center petals flecked with carmine. Very late.....	.40
Madame Ducl—Bomb type; midseason. A very large, wonderfully built flower; broad guard petals; center bomb shaped like a huge ball; very double and compact.....	.50
Madame Jules Dessert—Rose type; midseason. Color pure white overlaid with a sheen of delicate blush with a pronounced pink center, intermixed with golden stamens.....	1.50
Marie Jacquin—Water-lily peony. Semi-double, cup-shaped, white flowers, borne in great profusion. Beautiful landscape variety. Midseason50
Marie Lemoine—Rose type. Ivory white with occasional narrow carmine traces on some petals. Very late.....	.50
Martha Bulloch—Late. Enormous cup-shaped flowers of soft rose-pink, well formed and of good substance, supported on strong, stiff stems. Very vigorous and free bloomer. Fragrance quite pronounced but decidedly pleasing.....	5.00
Mary Brand—A midseason Peony of rich, deep red. Very beautiful	1.50
Milton Hill—Rose type; late. Flowers large, cupped, clear soft flesh color. Turns nearly white in full sunlight before fading. One of the finest varieties in existence.....	3.00
Mons. Jules Elie—Bomb type; early midseason. King of all Peonies. Color an ideal glossy lilac-pink, shading to a deeper rose at the base, the entre flower overlaid with a sheen of silver. Ideal for cut flowers50
Mons. M. Cahuzac—Semi-rose type; midseason. A perfect solid ball of deep maroon with garnet hues and brilliant black lustre.....	1.50
President Roosevelt—Semi-rose type; midseason. A variety purchased in England under number and named in Holland for our ex-President. It is a deep, rich, brilliant red in color, different from any red we know, and a grand Peony.....	.60
Primevere—Deep creamy yellow petals and center petals sulphur-yellow. Best yellow Peony grown.....	1.50
Princess Beatrice—Large compact high crown. Crown is light violet-rose; collar cream-white; center flecked crimson. Fragrant	.40
Rubra Officinalis—Beautiful carmine red. Early.....	.35
Rubra Superba—Rich brilliant crimson. Bomb type. Free bloomer. Very late50
Sarah Bernhardt—Semi-rose type. Midseason. Apple-blossom pink with each petal silver tipped, giving the appearance of a distinct border. Very strong growing and free blooming. Substance is heavy and lasting and as flowers are borne on strong, erect stems, they are unequalled for cutting. Delightfully fragrant.....	.75
Souv. De Chas. Gombault—Crown type. Midseason. Globular flower of deep pink with crimson splashes. Very beautiful.....	.75
Therese—Rose type. Midseason. One of the three highest rated Peonies. Color rich satiny pink with glossy reflex. Flowers are enormous in size of full rose type. Sturdy, vigorous grower with upright stems and rich green foliage. Delicately fragrant.....	2.00
