

This year, again, we are listing Peonies. We have selected the best varieties for either cutting or commercial purposes. All divisions will have from three to five eyes from two year clumps, free from disease and guaranteed true to name.

Albatre—A magnificent flower which opens like a rose. Pure white	
with a few pencilings of carmine on the edge of center petals.
