# *A Glad With Pockets and Spurs*

Nothing like it ever known,  
So it is named Partain's "ALONE."

Almost every petal of each floret, clear to the tip, has pockets and spurs, resembling those on the long-spurred columbine. The florets are over four inches across, very ruffled, almost self-color, a very soft, melting light salmon pink. It is very early and blooms from bulblets.

This Glad may start a new race of Glads and will be highly interesting for hybridizing purposes as well as being a beautiful Glad in itself.

## GOLDEN CHIMES

(Originated by Merton G. Ellis)

This is a most exquisite ruffled glad. The florets are large, wide open and a very clear yellow with brighter yellow throat. It is a very well-shaped, graceful spike and is as beautiful as the name signifies.

## BIRD OF PARADISE

(Originated by Mrs. George Crites)

This is a most gorgeous cerise pink, a worthy descendant of Purple Glory. The florets are large, wide open and well-placed. It attracts much attention for its unusual coloring and will be a great cut flower in the future.

## COMMODORE

(Originated by Mrs. Merton G. Ellis)

This is a gorgeous cut-flower either alone or arranged with Madame Mounet-Sully. Commodore is a very clear, bright-red with white throat, just the converse of Sully, which is white with bright-red throat. Such a combination is very striking. Commodore makes a graceful spike, many florets open and is a very satisfactory glad. It is somewhat similar to Lady Macbeth but an improvement in many ways. It is a better propagator, great germinator, produces a better spike, is considerably earlier and a healthier bulb.
