#### TO MY FRIENDS:

Please accept herewith, a copy of my price-list for the season of 1930. In it will be found many of the new and outstanding introductions from both the East and West. Probably the best of these being JANE COWL, EVA QUADLING AND WALKOVER PRINCE from the East and SANTA ANA, SAN CLEMENTE and SILVERADO from the West. Many others were grown by me, but due to insufficient stock are not listed, but could be supplied in small quantities. Your attention is directed to the very complete list of miniatures. They are becoming exceedingly popular and should be in every garden. I have priced them much more reasonable than most growers. I thank you for your past patronage and hope to maintain your confidence in the future.

#### SEED

Growing dahlias from seed is the most fascinating part of the game. As you probably know, the seed from the dahlia never produces an offspring similar to its parent, and from seedings only, are produced the new varieties that are placed on the market each are produced the new varieties that are placed on the market each year. Of course, all seed will not make exhibition flowers; in fact, if one or two out of a hundred plants are worth trying the second year, we feel amply rewarded. Seed will produce blooming plants in about 100 days, and will form a nice clump of tubers for the next season's planting. I am prepared to supply seed from nearly all varieties listed in this price list at \$2.00 per hundred seed. Complete cultural directions will be furrished with each order. I do not sell less than 100 seed, but will divide them in four varieties if preferred.

#### **GREEN PLANTS**

Green plants are probably more satisfactory to grow than tubers. They produce as gocd, or better plants, less liable to disease, and make finer flowers. The clumps however, will, as a rule, not produce as many tubers with "eyes" as a clump grown with a tuber. Green plants are only half the price of tubers except where tubers are priced \$2.00 or less, when the price is the same. They are furnished in pots and the culture is the same after planting as tubers. Plants are delivered after May 15.
