# SINGLE EARLY TULIPS

These are the most highly colored and really delightful varieties of the whole Tulip family because they bloom in April when bright colors are scarce and when flowers are so much wanted after the drabness of Winter. They are delightful when mixed with plantings of narcissus and hyacinths, and will fill in admirably the vacant places between the peony and other late-flowering perennials. Charming combinations can be made with other early-blooming flowers, or they may be planted in large, solid beds which later can be filled with annuals. In this respect, they are much more accommodating than the late-blooming Tulips, because the flowers will come and the foliage be ripened early enough to give the annuals an early start. Good gardeners are finding more and better uses for Early Tulips everywhere, and we detect a strong tendency toward increasing use of them in almost every garden. The prices, which were high several years ago, have fallen considerably, and anyone may plant them liberally at small expense.

## MISCELLANEOUS BULBS

Under this head are found many charming bulbous flowers useful because of their early blooming and small stature, enabling the gardener to tuck them into odd corners and to grow them in combination with many other plants. The smaller bulbs are especially valuable for the rock garden, particularly the Chionodoxas, Scillas and Snowdrops. Crocuses make lovely borders and edges, but are a little too large and flashy for the delicate beauty of early rock garden plants. All of these bulbs look best when planted in large masses and because the prices are very low this year, we recommend buying them by the hundreds and thousands and planting them with a liberal and lavish hand where their graceful beauty may make the best effect.

In the rock garden, clumps of a dozen or so of the smaller bulbs look well tucked in against evergreens or in the lee of a large rugged stone. They may be worked very nicely between later flowering perennials, or they may be covered with small, creeping things like Thyme and Veronica.

# AMAZING OFFER IN DAFFODILS

SEP 10 1931

Following the embargo on the importation of Daffodils from Europe, the prices shot sky-high, but after ten years' intensive work in this country, Daffodils have become cheaper and available in such quantities that everybody can have them. Because of labor conditions and the difficulty of rapidly increasing the stock above present levels, it is not believed that this year's prices will be lowered for some time to come. We therefore urge our customers to place their orders for Daffodils at once in order to get the present low figures, and to make sure of receiving the bulbs for early Autumn planting.

The Daffodils, or Narcissus, have several very marked forms, depending on the length, of the cup or trumpet. The longest of these is called the Trumpet, and the shortest, the Poeticus. Between them are the Leedsi and Barri and Incomparabilis, differing in length of trumpet and coloring. We have indicated below the class in which each belongs. Plant Narcissus in clumps of a single variety, or in broad sweeps on a half-shaded hillside, or in a meadow, for early Spring effect.
