<b>Albatre</b> —A magnificent flower which opens like a rose. Pure white with a few pencilings or carmine on the edge of center petals, fragrant .....	\$ .30
<b>Albert Crousse</b> —A very full flower of a pure, delicate shell pink, without any markings.....	.30
<b>Alexander Dumas</b> —Prolific bloomer of a brilliant rose-pink.....	.30
<b>Augustine d'Hour</b> —Midseason, extremely large; color very deep, rich brilliant solferino-red with silvery reflex.....	.35
<b>Baroness Schroeder</b> —Late. White with shadings of flesh. One of the finest peonies. Its immense flowers of great substance with very high chalice-shaped center are freely produced. Very fragrant.....	.45
<b>Charles McKellip</b> —Crown type; midseason. The irregular rich crimson petals of the center are mingled with gold stamens.....	.50
<b>Chestine Gowdy</b> —Crown type; late midseason. Their very broad outer petals are silvery pink, tinted with a deep rich cream. One of the finest cut flower varieties.....	.50
<b>Duchess de Nemours</b> —Early. A lovely pure white variety, with sulphur-white collar. Very fragrant.....	.30
<b>Edulis Superba</b> —Deep mauve pink. Very early, tall and extremely floriferous .....	.25
<b>Eugene Verdier</b> —Pale hydrangea pink.....	.25
<b>Felix Crousse</b> —Bright red, very large and fragrant. One of the best reds for cut flower purposes. Midseason.....	.35
<b>Festiva Maxima</b> —Early. Pure white with crimson markings in the center. Very large and one of the finest whites. Fragrant.....	.25
<b>Germaine Bigot</b> —A most excellent lilac rose. Very large. Midseason	.30

<b>Karl Rosenfield</b> —A better Peony and a better quality of red than any of the others, a pure rich, intense crimson. No equal as a cut flower .....	.40
<b>Kelway's Queen</b> — The true variety is one of the most beautiful peonies. In color it is a uniform mauve-rose, with the broad center petals tipped with carmine. Fragrant.....	3.00
<b>La Fee</b> —Crown type; large globular flowers, with a silvery and a creamy yellow collar. Beautiful rose-pink. Fragrant.....	1.00
<b>La Cygne</b> —Pure white, perfect large form, early.....	3.50
