Plant Peonies in good soil, in full sun if possible, and away from trees, buildings, etc. Do not plant where a peony has been before, unless all old soil is taken out and replaced with fresh. Plant 3 to 4 feet apart; set so that the eyes point upward and are 2 to 3 inches below the top of ground (very important). Give each root 2 quarts of water when planted, and then make a 6 inch mound of dirt above ground level to prevent heaving, scrape mound away late next spring.

Important. Open your package of roots immediately when they arrive, if dry, soak in water. Plant as soon as possible, but if you have to wait a few days, either keep moist in open box in cool cellar, or better yet, bury in garden.

THE AUTEN PEONIES

It would be much easier to show you the Auten Peonies in bloom than to try to describe them. We all enjoy seeing new things. After seven years, my total list of 75 is reduced by only two withdrawals for discard, Clorinda and Corinne. Some of the others have been enthusiastically received by the public, many are so recent they have not yet had a thorough trial. For the nine years beginning 1923, only one grower (from Ohio) has received more awards on new Peonies from the American Peony Society than I, and no other grower has received more than two thirds as many as I. In 1931, besides receiving the medal for best new Peony at National Show, I received one third of all awards given, and twice as many as any other originator. This against probably the stiffest competition in seedlings ever known at a National Show.

This is told not for boasting, but simply to show that the Auten standards are high. I am seeking for "Peonies that are different," new forms, clear colors, good and graceful plant habit; enduring reds. Many of the new Auten reds should be of great value in further breeding. The Auten singles will set a new standard, especially in whites and dark reds; the Auten Japs are covering an entirely new range of colors and forms.

Prices on the earlier kinds have been reduced in this list just as low as stocks would permit. 1931 introductions are unchanged, as they were priced at bedrock, and any change should be upward.

Planted in large pot with 4 inches of soil above bulb, and good drainage, this lily will force indoors in winter as easily as a paper white narcissus, and makes a gorgeous display.
