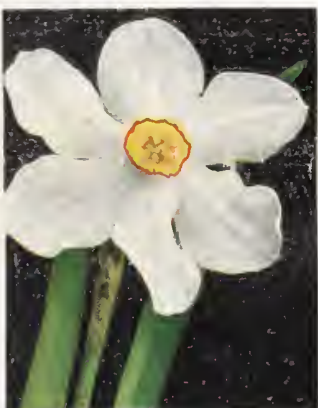

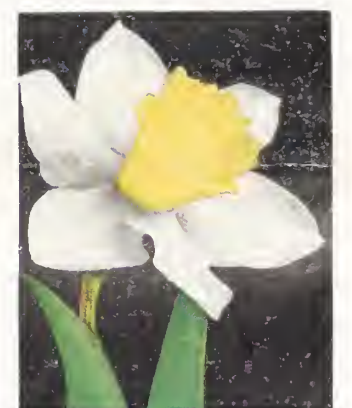

FANTASTIC PARROT TULIPS

These are the freaks of the Tulip family. The very large buds usually twist and turn in a way to suggest the head and beak of a parrot.

TULIP SPECIES

The range of variety in the Tulip species is practically as wide as in the cultivated varieties. They are all perfectly hardy and can be left in the ground year after year, establishing themselves and occasionally spreading into broad patches. The smaller species, especially Clusiana, Australis, Sylvestris, and others, are particularly striking and permanent residents of the rock-garden, provided they are given a sunny, well-drained slope, and a good depth of soil in which to dig themselves in. Their vivid colors make brave pictures against the dull grays of the rocks in the spring and blend well with the many shades of blue and white displayed by other small bulbs such as those offered on page 7.

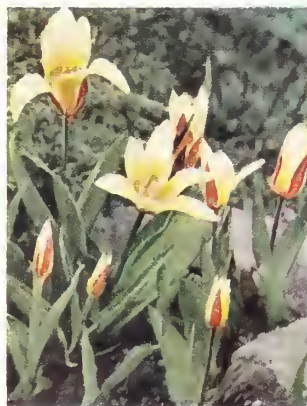
