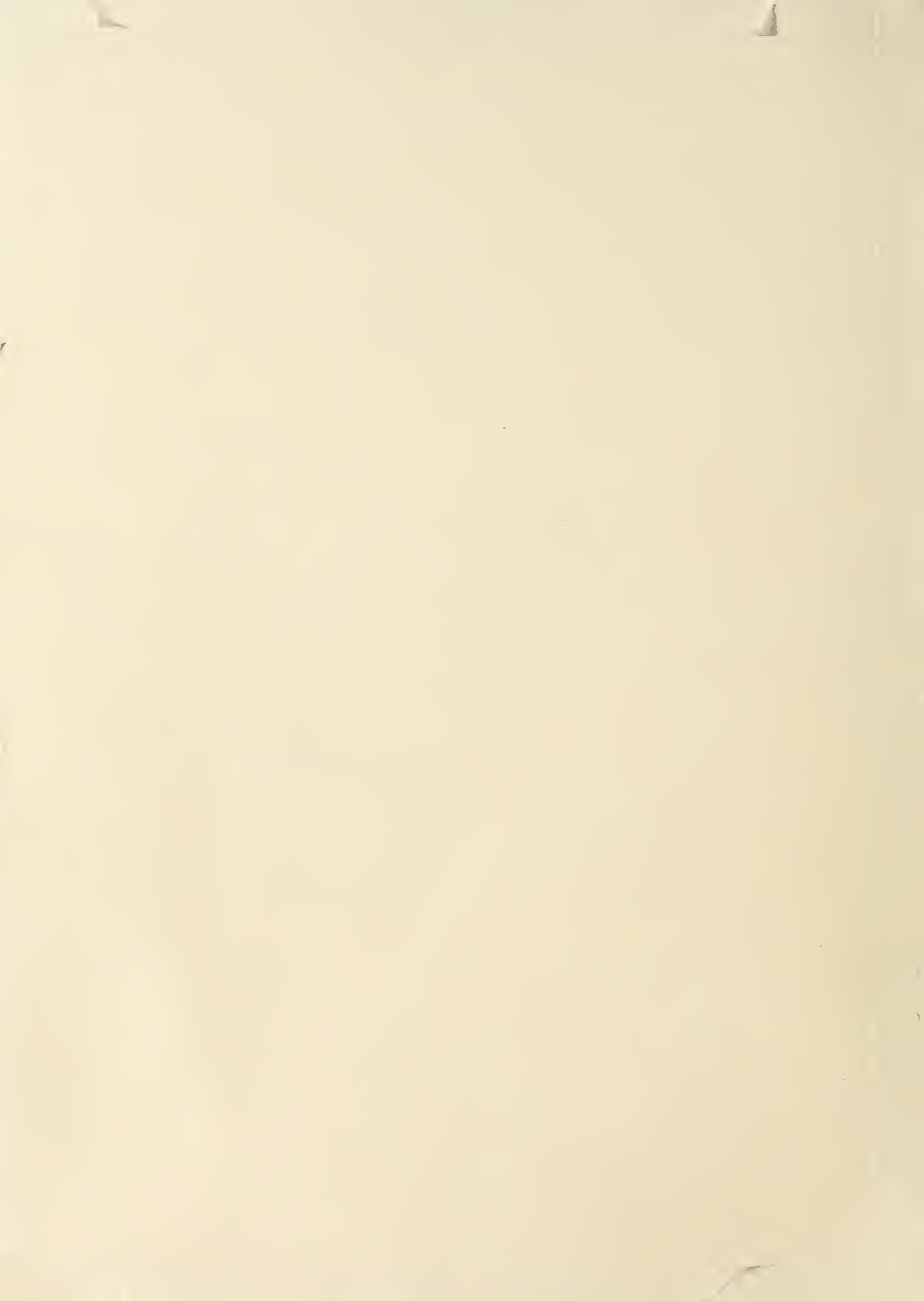

**HOW TO PLANT AND CARE FOR ROSES**  
 Roses for best results should be planted deep in good, rich soil, and cut back to within 8 or 10 inches of the ground. There is nothing gained by leaving a long top on a newly planted rose. The disturbed roots have not the strength to supply the old top, but when cut back and well soaked with water the sprouts soon appear. Many roses which are thought dead will soon start growing if treated this way. They require much watering until they start growing.  
 Roses with the exception of the hardy Rugosa varieties and climbing varieties should be cut back each spring to within a foot of the ground. The hardy Rugosa Roses require no covering in the fall. Nearly all other varieties require winter protection. Cover with straw or leaves and burlap, or bank them up with dirt or Peat soil (Humus). Climbing roses should be taken down, the strands tied together and laid flat on the ground, weighted down, and covered with straw or peat.



The climbing roses bloom on the last year's canes. When trimming cut out only the old small brush at the base of the rose. If you cut off the large canes, you will have few if any blossoms the following year.

Shrubs should be planted deep, soil pressed down solid, and watered well the first week or two. If shrubs are cut back one-third they root and grow much faster.

When planting a tree cut back top branches one-half. Dig the hole deep and fill with water which should be allowed to settle. Set tree deep and tamp hard with foot. After tree is planted water again. Then water about twice a week for a month if in sandy soil. Less watering is required in heavy soil. Some varieties of trees will drown if watered too much.

When planting in a rock garden, use some of the tall growing varieties for back ground, such as the American and Pyramid Arbor Vitae, Austrian and Scotch Pine, Norway Spruce and Canadian Hemlock.

The Junipers and Arbor Vitae can be trimmed to prevent spreading or growing too tall.

### IT IS EASY TO MAKE A ROCK GARDEN

A rock garden should be something besides just a load of rock dumped on the ground with a little dirt thrown in between the rocks and a few plants added. To be fascinating a rock garden should represent something in nature. Who would care to see meadows and prairies covered with rock? But if we visit the mountains or steep banks of rivers or lakes and fail to find ledges of rocks and boulders of all kinds, we would be disappointed.

It is on the mountain slopes and cliffs where we find the Alpine or rock plants growing, so let us make some mountains and valleys in miniature. If you wish a pool make it irregular to represent a lake with an island or peninsula, etc. Select a spot near the side or back of the lot line. Use some shrubs or evergreens for a background. Dig the pool about 18 to 24 inches deep, and cement the bottom and sides 4 to 5 inches thick. Use the dirt to shape the mountains and valleys around the pool. Leave enough open space in front for entrance to pool.

If the dirt is clay, add some sand or gravel to it, then mix in about 3 or 4 inches of our humus or peat soil. It supplies fertility and prevents the soil from washing. Dig pockets here and there and set your rock. Some prefer imported rock, but native rock is all right. Use the flat rock for cliff effect, boulders and odd shaped rocks on the slopes and foot hills. Then tamp the soil down between the rocks and set in the plants. Use some of the taller varieties near the pool.

Before starting your rock garden practice on a few tiny ones for models to get the shape you want. It will save time and produce some interesting results.

### BLACK DIRT

Our black dirt is nearly all humus. Humus is decayed vegetation and decayed vegetation is nature's fertilizer. Nothing of importance will grow without it. Decayed vegetation produces a rank growth of new vegetation wherever used, in flower pots, window boxes, flower beds, gardens or lawns.

The Black Dirt which we have been selling for many years is a product of an old lake bottom or peat bog. The accumulation of peat is the result of dead and decayed grasses, roots and other vegetable matter. It is similar to leaf mold which has long been considered of great benefit to soil.

Peat soil at one time was considered useless for garden or farm crops, but now that tractors are being used to thoroughly pulverize the soil, wonderful crops are raised. Horticultural publications are claiming great results are obtained by the use of peat for many purposes. It is now, being dried, bailed and sold by the name of Peat Moss. Much of it is shipped here from Europe. Some people are still condemning and advising their friends against the use of peat soil. Some claim it will burn, or dry up and blow away. Leaf mold will also burn, or dry up and blow away. Horticulturists claim that peat will hold from 10 to 15 times its weight in moisture. Some people claim plants grown in peat soil are small and stunted, while others complain that they grow too big. Like the first locomotive engine—they said it would never run, but if it ever did get started, they would never be able to stop it.

Many of our customers who have been using this soil for a number of years have reported wonderful results by mixing it with other soil in their gardens; while those who just spread it on the top of the ground are not so successful. It is too light unless mixed with other soil. For window boxes use one-third peat mixed with other soil. For lawns, first mow the grass, then spread soil on about one inch thick and rake thoroughly. The grass roots soon take up the soil. If the lawn is poor, this can be done at intervals through spring, summer or fall. For using in rock gardens and terraces it prevents the soil from washing. For mixing with clay it softens the soil and prevents it from caking. It retains the moisture when used in sandy or gravelly soil.

### LAWN GRASS SEED

A good mixture of Clover, Red-top and Kentucky Bluegrass.

Grade No. 1.....Lb. 45c
