Give a thought to the little enemy which feasts in your garden, and which is planning this year to bring out a much larger family than last. The Japanese Beetle eats many different shrubs and trees. Other varieties it does not like, and seldom or never injures.

Are you planting for your own enjoyment or for the beetle's? If for your own, select Guyencourt Beetle-proof varieties.

You can and should spray your non-beetle-proof flower plants and small shrubs with a suitable poison to save them. Shrubs and trees which grow larger can be sprayed only at great expense and trouble.

When setting out new shrubs or trees for the future, ask yourself, "Shall I plant beetle-food or ornaments?"



BEETLE-PROOF AMERICAN HOLLY

attack them, are so beautiful that no garden would be complete without their presence. But you can plant your grounds virtually beetle-proof, yet keep the utmost quality and elegance.

***Cutting - Grown Named Hybrid Rhodendrons**

These superb varieties propagated by our improved method are hardier, stronger plants, with no understock to sap their vitality.

Plant in soil lightened and acidified with peat or acid leaf-mold. Give some shade, and shelter from the worst wind. Keep permanently mulched with oak leaves. Never dig around the roots. Never lime.

To Reach GUYENCOURT by Road

From Wilmington, Del. — 5 miles

West on Pennsylvania Ave. and Kennett Pike 2 miles. Turn right on Montchanin Road toward Chadds Ford 2 miles. Turn left at cross road 1 mile. Pass under P. & R. tracks at Guyencourt Station. Turn right at Guyencourt Nurseries sign.

From Holly Oak — 10 miles

Turn right off Penny Hill on Shipley Road, left on Welldin Road to Blue Ball, Rockland and straight ahead. Turn right at Guyencourt Nurseries sign.

From Philadelphia — 30 miles

West on Baltimore Ave. and Baltimore Pike (Route 1) to Chadds Ford. Turn left on Route 62, 4 miles to Guyencourt Station. Turn left at Guyencourt Nurseries sign.
