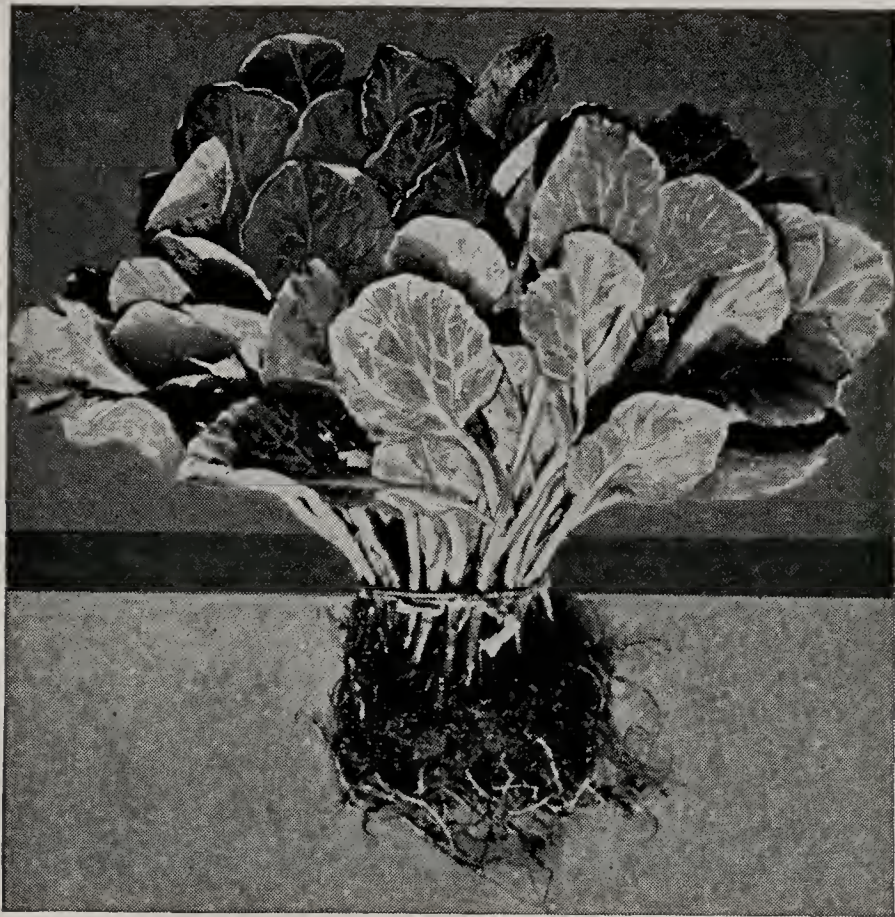

Here at Tifton, Georgia, where my plantation is located, the soil and climatic conditions are ideally suited for growing tough, hardy, healthy Cabbage plants in the open field during the winter and early spring. The plants make a slow but steady growth and when eight to ten weeks old they are extremely tough and hardy. In this condition they can be shipped to territory farther north and be planted in the open fields there a month or six weeks earlier than home-grown, hot bed, or cold frame plants.

These Frost-Proof Cabbage plants will stand temperatures of 18 to 20 degrees above zero without injury. Freezing of the soil or covering of the plants with ice, sleet or snow after they have been planted will not injure them unless the temperature gets below 18 or 20 degrees.

Because my plants are so strong and healthy, and because they can safely be planted considerably in advance of home-grown plants, is the reason for their being able to make large, extra early crops—all ready for marketing during the time prices are highest.

Many unreliable growers are selling plants and are calling them "frost-proof." In many instances these growers are located where they do not have frosts during the growing period and therefore the plants they are offering have never been subjected to frosts. Where my plantation is located we have light frosts all through the winter growing season and as all of my plants are grown right out in the open fields, Mother Nature provides them with the strength and stamina to withstand cold temperatures. Be sure you buy genuine FROST-PROOF plants for a sure crop.

This year I have acre after acre of the finest Cabbage plants I have ever had. Climatic conditions have been perfect and they are in unusually fine condition, being tough and hardy and ready to start growing in your ground whenever you can plant them in your locality. I treat all my seed before planting to prevent disease and as further precautions, I change my lands each year and spray the plants often during cultivation.

HOW TO GROW FULWOOD'S GENUINE FROST-PROOF CABBAGE PLANTS

To grow a good crop of Cabbage, I would advise selecting a deep sandy loam with a Southern exposure if possible. Apply broadcast from ten to fifteen loads of well rotted stable manure to the acre and plow in. The land should be harrowed thoroughly and rows laid off three to three and one-half feet apart. Apply about 500 pounds of high-grade fertilizer to the acre and mix well with the soil. If you have no stable manure, apply from ten to fifteen hundred pounds of fertilizer per acre, half broadcast and half in the drill. As Cabbage are gross-feeders, please bear in mind that you cannot fertilize them too heavily. The Wakefield, Copenhagen and Golden Acre varieties should be set out from fifteen to twenty inches apart, and other varieties from twenty-four to thirty inches apart. It is important to set the plants deep in the ground, up to the first leaf, in order to keep the stem from freezing and cracking, which will cause the plant to fall over and die. You can plant about twelve thousand plants of the Wakefields per acre and ten thousand of the flat head varieties per acre. The first cultivation should be deep, but when they start to head, cultivate them shallow and apply 200 pounds of nitrate of soda per acre.

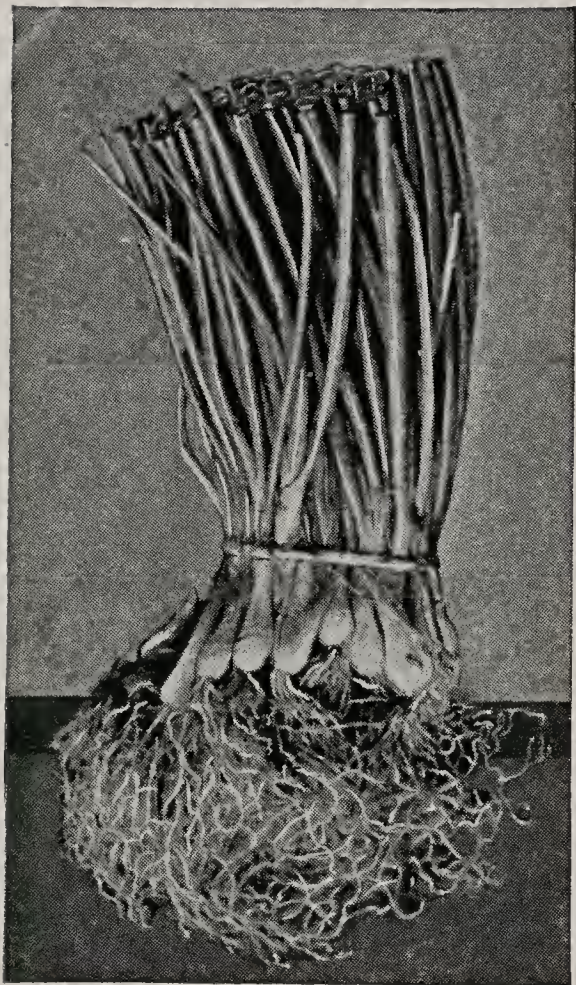

Like all Genuine Fulwood Vegetable Plants, my onion plants are grown, packed and shipped with the utmost care and precision. Plants are grown from the very finest seed I can obtain. All seed is treated before planting and plants are sprayed during the growing period and thus you are assured of good healthy, strong plants. Because they are grown in the open field and are subject to light frosts during the growing period, they are Genuine Frost-Proof plants and will stand tem-

peratures as low as 18 to 20 degrees above zero without injury.

Onions grown from Fulwood's Genuine Frost-Proof Onion Plants are also an excellent money crop as they can be marketed at least two weeks in advance of onions grown from sets and way ahead of onions grown from seed. Furthermore, my plants will make much better onions than those grown from sets, the onions being larger and they do not run to seed. They will also keep much better when cured and stored.

My Onion plants should be set out the same time as my Cabbage plants and you can order them for shipment at the same time. Prices are the same as for Cabbage plants and I will gladly mix an order, shipping part Onion plants and part Cabbage plants, if you desire.

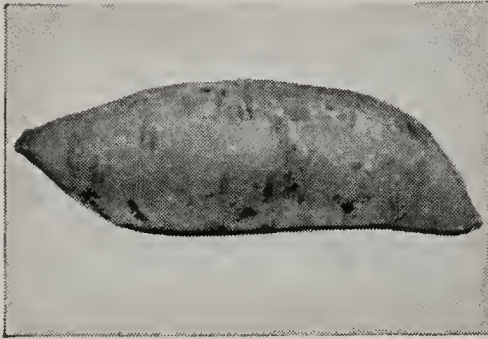

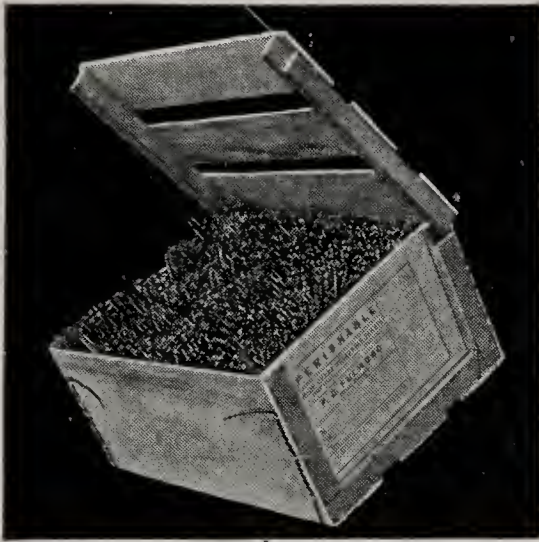

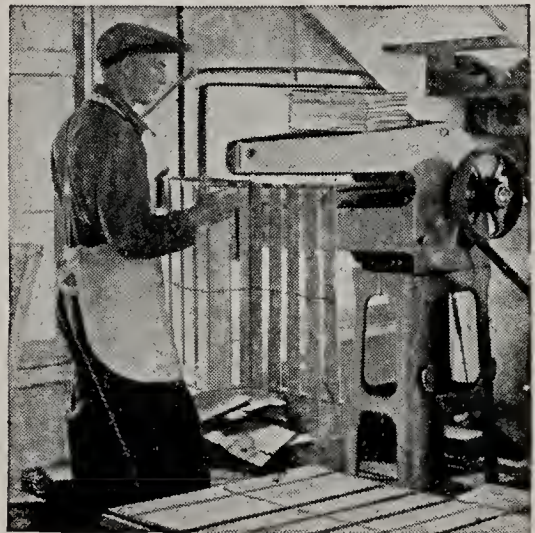
ONION PLANTS IN CRATE

After I have grown the very finest plants possible to grow, it would be right down foolishness to pack and ship them in any manner whereby I would run the slightest chance of their not reaching you in perfect condition, I have perfected my packing and shipping methods to the point where I can fully guarantee all my plants will arrive at destination in perfect condition for planting. All plants are pulled, sorted, counted, bundled, packed, crated and shipped, all on the same day. This insures maximum freshness at the time of shipping. All shipments are made on the same day orders are received, except when unusually bad weather prohibits getting into the fields for a day or two. I could pull my plants several days ahead and keep them in cold storage, as some plant growers do, but such methods would prohibit my iron-bound guarantee of all plants arriving in perfect condition.

My twenty-four years of experience has taught me much about sorting, bundling, packing and crating and when your plants arrive you'll have a good full count—they'll be correctly packed

in light-weight wire bound, strong, well ventilated crates and there will be no runts or damaged plants. My shipping crates are assembled right here with my own machinery. I have designed the correct kind of crates for each plant and all shipments will arrive at destination with crates and contents intact.

The kind of plants, the season of the year, and other factors to be considered, determine whether the roots of the plants shall, or shall not be packed in damp moss and wrapped in waxed paper. Such packing is not always advisable and inasmuch as I guarantee my plants to arrive in perfect condition I reserve the right to select the most proper method of packing at the time shipments are made.

All Genuine Fulwood plants are perfectly produced and shipped—they are priced exceptionally low, especially for plants of such high quality—they will produce vegetables of the very highest quality at the very earliest possible time.
