It is not a fancy one with pictures and long descriptions—just a modest effort to tell you of Glads that have proven satisfactory for all purposes and are the most admired both in the garden and at the shows. This list includes nearly all of the fifty favorites of the four-year symposium of the American Gladiolus Society and many of the fine recent introductions that give promise of becoming future favorites.

These bulbs are grown in the fertile black loam of central Illinois—the type of soil that produces those plump, high-crowned, healthy bulbs that yield so rich a return in beauty. State inspected and pronounced free of all disease.

When it comes to Thrips. I'm like Will Rogers, "All I know is what I read in the papers". The only thrips that I have ever seen were pickled in a little bottle that a friend brought from the infested area. Careful daily inspection of my field last Summer failed to reveal any of the little pests and I can state, without fear of contradiction, that central Illinois is THRIP FREE. The recent nation-wide zero weather probably destroyed what thrips and eggs were in the ground and the Glad fancier, whose bloom was wrecked by thrips last season, should be rewarded with a galaxy of beauty if careful in planting only GUARANTEED THRIP FREE BULBS.

In planning your garden, if you are undecided as to what varieties are best adapted for your cut flower purposes, write me your needs and give me the color scheme of your home and I will gladly submit you a list of suitable varieties.

GUARANTEE

I GUARANTEE bulbs to be:

- (a) *True to name.*
- (b) *Free of disease.*
- (c) *Regulation size, mechanically graded to 1/16" oversize.*
- (d) *Free from thrips.*

If bulbs are not satisfactory in every respect, return at my expense and your money will be gladly refunded.

A generous overcount is made for each item of 10 or more bulbs and extras of varieties other than ordered included in each order.
