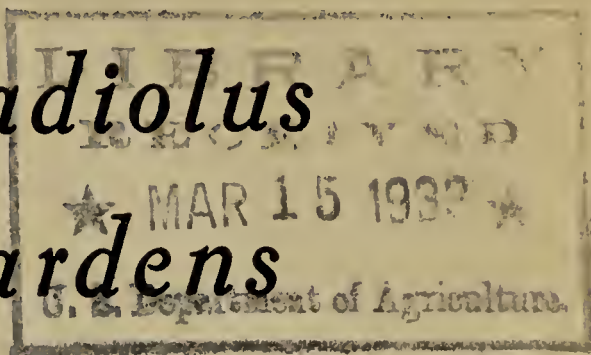

DR. NELSON SHOOK, (R.) Deep tyrian rose, large spikes.	.15
E. I. FARRINGTON, (P. P.) Clear light yellow, a winner.	.35
E. J. SHAYLOR, (R.) Tall strong spike, with blooms of beautiful deep rose-pink.	.05
ELIZABETH TABOR, (P. P.) Delicate rosy pink on white ground, rich dark crimson blotch on lower petals. Very early.	.05
ELORA, (P. P.) Color creamy-white with rich cream spots in throat on lower petals overlaid with dainty feathering of American Beauty pink. Spikes over 4 feet tall and flowers 4 to 5 inches in diameter. Very early.	.15
EMILE AUBRUN, Unusual variety from Australia. Salmon, orange and bronze, slaty overtone, cherry-red blotch in center.	.10
FERN KYLE, (R.) Massive creamy white, exhibition variety.	.15
GAIETY, (P. P.) Salmon-pink, flaked salmon-red, white blotches on lower petals.	.10

HELEN FRANKLIN, (R.) White with violet markings.	.05
HERADA, (P. P.) Large mauve colored flowers of rare beauty.	.10
HIGH NYE, (P. P.) Old-rose, yellow throat, tall.	.25
LONGFELLOW, One of the most beautiful varieties ever introduced. Entire flower of the clearest La France-pink, prominent lighter midrib. Flowers large, wide open. Spikes tall and slender and always straight	.10
LOS ANGELES, (R.) Delicate pink with cerise feather in throat. Usually several flower stalks from one bulb.	.05
MARY FREY, Deep shade of rose-lilac, with ruby blotch in throat.	.10
MARY PICKFORD, (P. P.) Creamy white, throat soft sulphur yellow. Very early.	.05
MME. MOUNET-SULLY, (P. P.) Pale yellowish white, dark red blotch in throat. A beauty very much admired.	.35
MARIETTA, (P. P.) Rich salmon-orange, tall, fine variety.	.10
